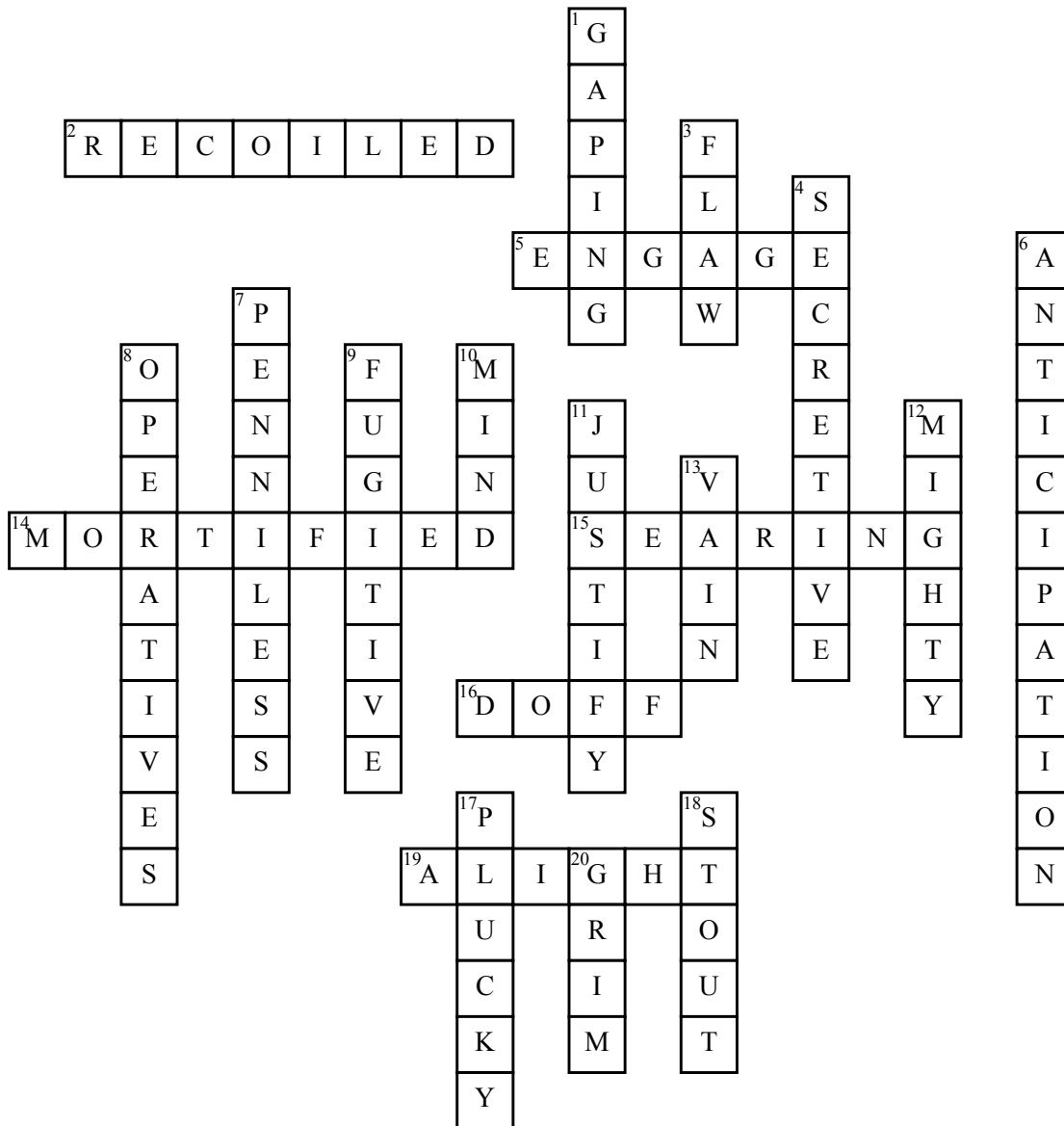


Lyddie Vocabulary Crossword
