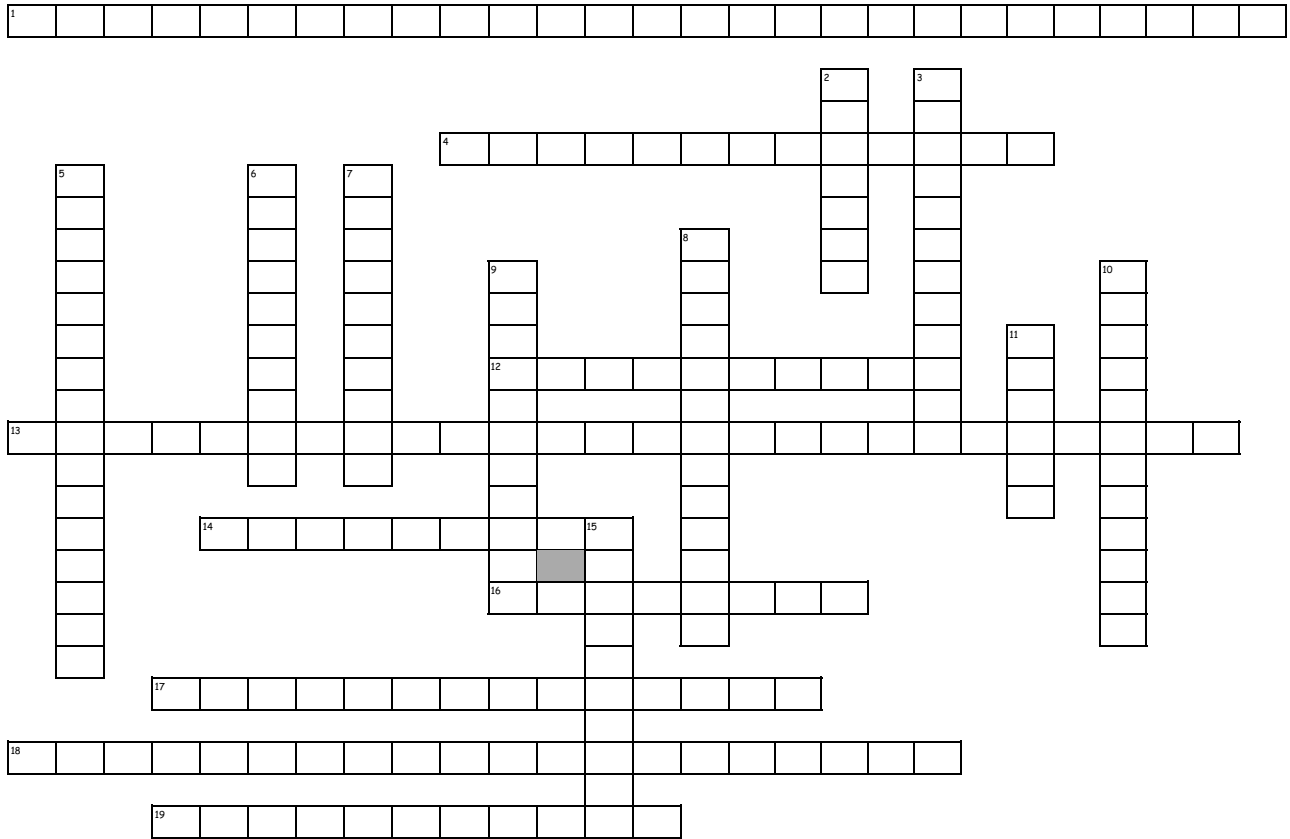


Civil War Battles

4. Confederate General Robert E. Lee cemented his reputation as a great general
12. Grant's biggest defeat by Lee
13. The capture of these forts guaranteed Union control of Kentucky
14. With this defeat, the Confederacy was split in two by the Mississippi River
16. The bloodiest battle of the Civil War.
17. The low point of the Civil war for the Union
18. Robert E. Lee surrendered to Ulysses Grant
19. Opened the way for a full scale attack on Atlanta by General Sherman

2. Marked the beginning of Sherman's march to the sea
3. First sizable engagement of the Civil War
5. This was the greatest Confederate victory of the Civil War
6. First shot fired in the Civil War
7. This siege spelled the end of the confederacy.
8. General Sherman and his troops marched from Atlanta, GA to the sea in Savannah, GA
9. One of the few times the Confederate forces were on the offense rather than the defense
10. First clash of ironclads
11. Ended hopes of South regaining Tennessee
15. The turning point of the Civil War
