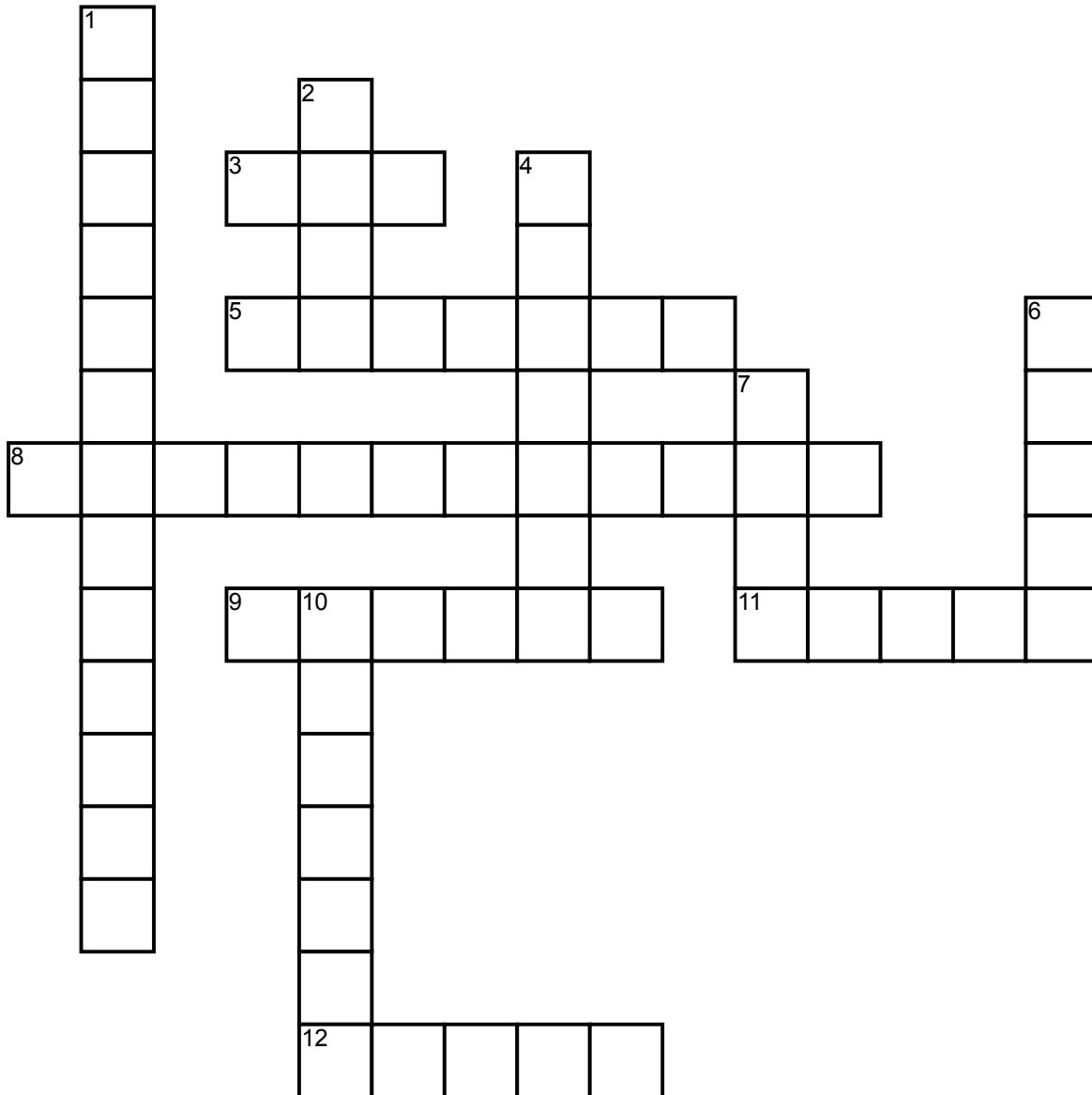


# Beer City USA



## Across

**3.** A cylindrical container, usually made of steel or aluminum, that is used to store, transport, and serve beer under pressure

**5.** A refillable half gallon or 2-liter glass bottle that is used to sell beer to-go

**8.** The chemical breakdown of a substance by bacteria, yeasts, or other microorganisms

**9.** Cereal grain that is used as a base malt in the production of beer and some distilled spirits

**11.** Type of beer that has a rich, creamy head and is flavored and colored by barley. Often uses a combination of unroasted barley to develop a dark, coffee-like taste.

**12.** Any beer that is fermented with bottom-fermenting yeast at colder temperatures. Often associated with crisp, clean flavors and served at colder temperatures than ales.

**1.** This established the prohibition of alcoholic beverages in the United States by declaring illegal the production, transport, and sale of alcohol

**2.** A drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavored with hops

**4.** Founder's. Medium-bodied with a distinct floral hop aroma and refreshing citrus flavor

**6.** This microorganism converts the natural malt sugars into alcohol and carbon dioxide during the fermentation process.

**7.** This contributes to the bitterness, aroma, and flavor into the beer. Also prevents the growth of bacteria in beer

**10.** The colorless primary constituent of beer. Ranges for beer can be anywhere from less than 3.2% to greater than 14%.
