**1.** the attribution of a personal nature or human characteristics to something non-human,

**7.** a group of lines forming the basic recurring metrical unit in a poem; a verse.

**9.** the expression of one's meaning by using language that normally signifies the opposite

**11.** several uses of a word, phrase or idea for emphasis eg: over and over and over

**12.** a state or feeling of excited or anxious uncertainty about what may happen

**2.** a figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or action to which it is not literally applicable.

3. Extreme exaggeration used for emphasis or effect/ statement that is not meant to take literally
4. repetition of vowel sounds eg: (killed, cold, culled) **5.** a joke exploiting the different possible meanings of a word or the fact that there are words which sound alike but have different meanings.

**6.** visually descriptive or figurative language, especially in a literary work

**8.** an expression designed to call something to mind without mentioning it explicitly; an indirect or passing reference

**10.** a strong, regular repeated pattern of movement or sound.
