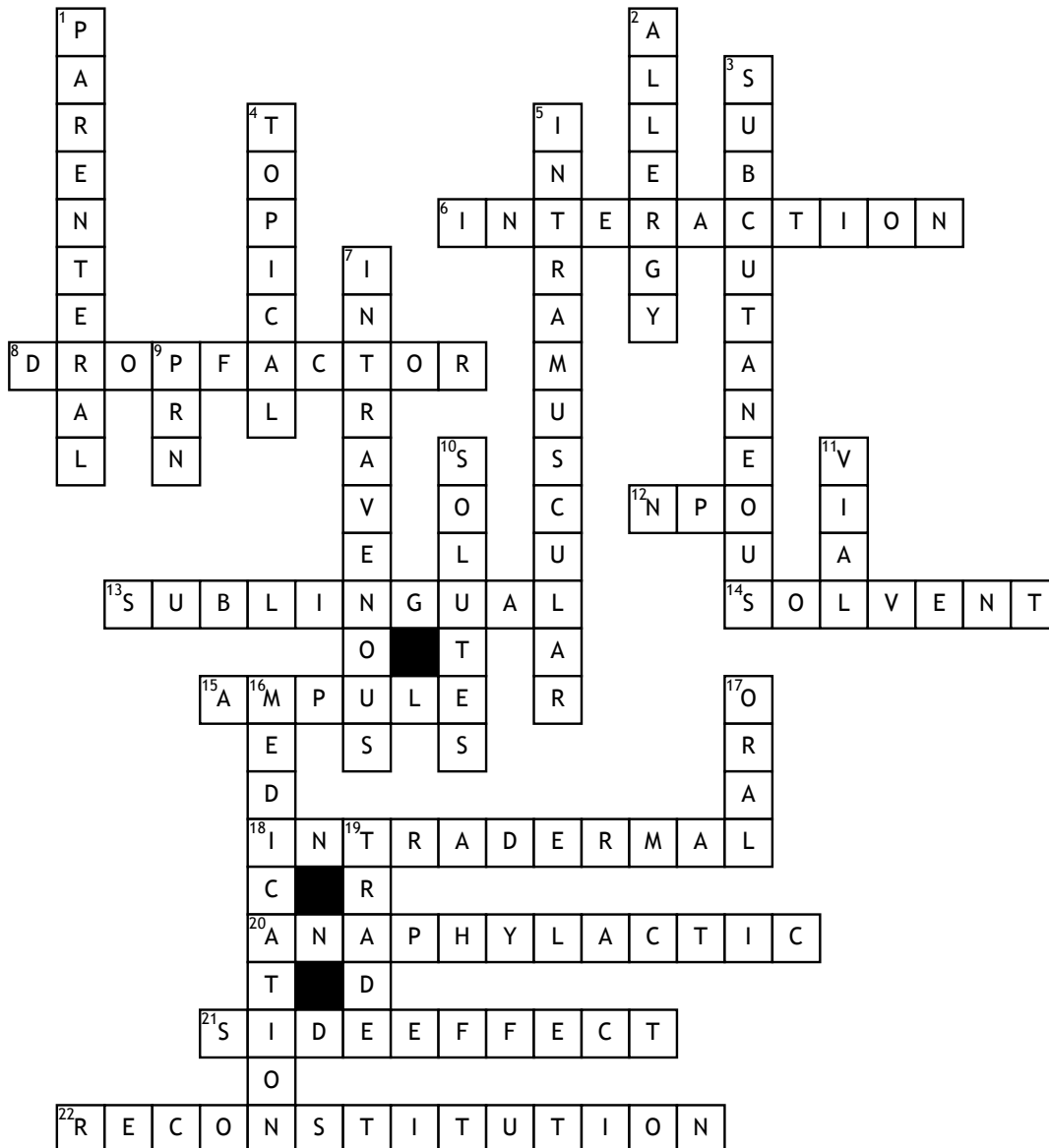

## Across

6. the beneficial or harmful interaction of one drug with another drug

8. the number of drops that equal 1 mL as specified on the package of IV tubing

12. Nothing by mouth; literally, "nil per os"

13. a method of drug administration in which the drug is placed under the tongue

14. the liquid in which a solute is dissolved

15. a glass container usually designed to hold a single dose of a drug

18. the administration of a drug into the dermal layer of the skin just beneath the epidermis

20. a severe allergic reaction that usually occurs immediately after the administration of a drug

21. the secondary effect of a drug that is unintended; usually predictable and may be either harmless or potentially harmful

22. adding a specific amount of water to a powder to make a liquid.

1. drug administration using a medication route other than the alimentary or digestive tract; injected into the body intradermally, subcutaneously, intramuscularly, or intravenously

2. an immunologic reaction to a drug

3. beneath the layers of the skin; hypodermic

4. applied externally (e.g., to the skin or mucous membranes)

5. the administration of a drug into the muscle tissue

7. the administration of a drug into the vein

9. permits the nurse to give a medication when, in the nurse's judgment, the client requires it

10. substances dissolved in a liquid

11. a small glass medication container with a sealed rubber cap; used for single or multiple doses

16. a substance administered for the diagnosis, cure, treatment, or relief of a symptom or for prevention of disease

17. a method of administration in which the drug is swallowed

19. name of the drug given by the drug manufacturer; also known as a brand name
