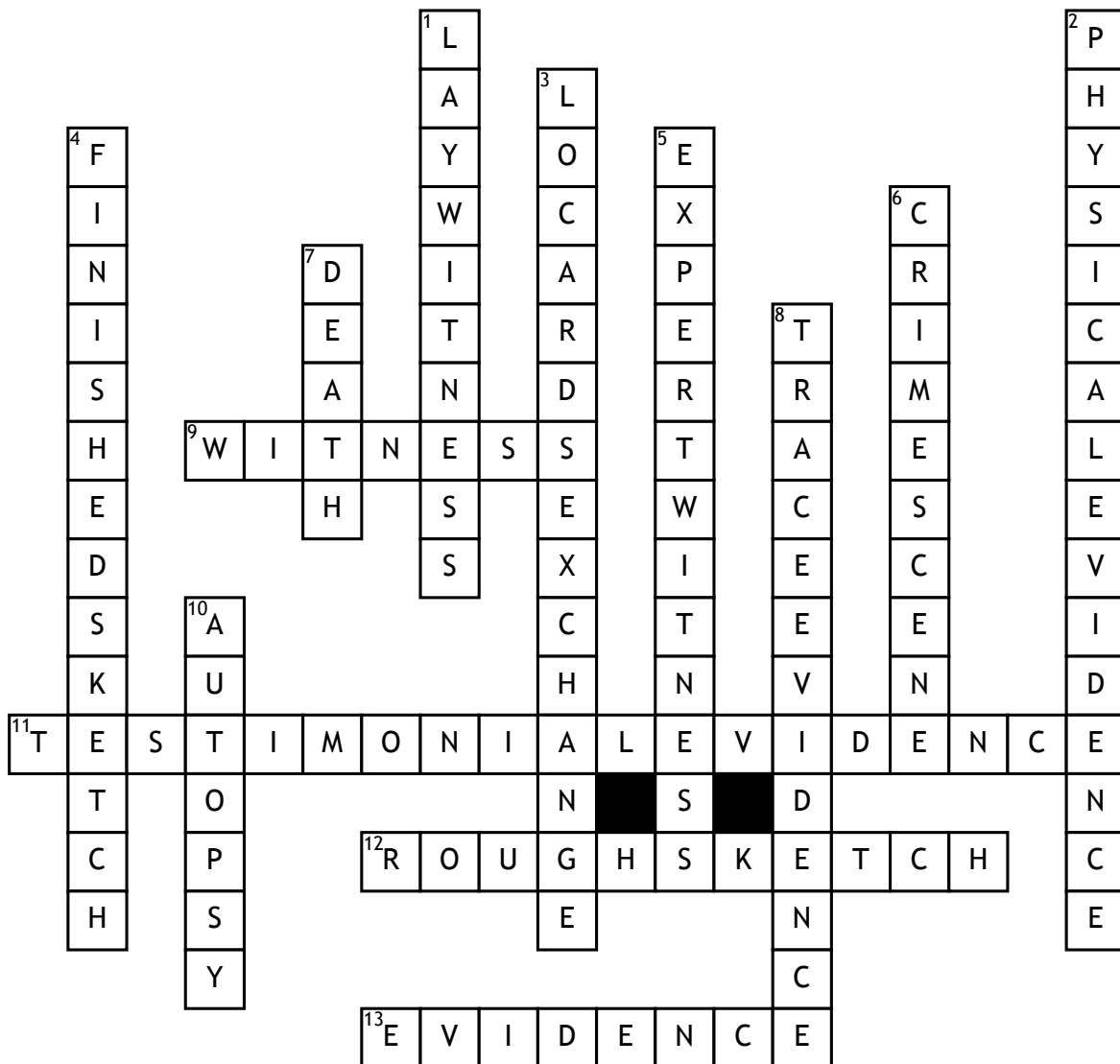

1. A witness who can truthfully and accurately testify on a fact in question without having specialized training or knowledge; an ordinary witness.
 2. Any object that can establish that a crime has been committed or can link a crime and its victim or its perpetrator.
 3. States that there is an exchange of materials when two objects come into contact with each other.
 4. a precise rendering of the crime scene, usually drawn to scale.

5. a witness with professional training or substantial experience qualifying him/her to testify on a certain subject
 6. The location where a crime has been committed or any place that evidence relating to a crime may be found.
 7. the action or fact of dying or being killed; the end of the life of a person or organism.
 8. refers to physical evidence that is found in small but measurable amounts, such as strands of hair, fibers, or skin cells.
 10. examination of a dead body
