1. A range of negative attitudes and feelings toward homosexuality or people who are identified or perceived as being lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT).
2. A person who experiences sexual, romantic, physical, and/or spiritual attraction for members of all gender identities/expressions, not just people who fit into the standard gender binary (i.e. men and women).
3. A term which refers to the ways in which we each manifest masculinity or femininity.
4. The process of acknowledging one's sexual orientation and/or gender identity to other people. For most LGBT people this is a life-long process.
5. It is frequently used as an umbrella term to refer to all people who do not identify with their assigned gender at birth or the binary gender system.
6. A person who generally does not feel sexual attraction or desire to any group of people. Asexuality is not the same as celibacy.
7. A person whose sexual anatomy or chromosomes do not fit with the traditional markers of "female" and "male."
8. The fear or hatred of transgender people or gender non-conforming behavior.

3. Types of gender identity where an individual's experience of their own gender matches the sex they were assigned at birth.
4. Aversion toward bisexuality and bisexual people as a social group or as individuals.
5. These acronyms refer to Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or Questioning, and Asexual or Ally
6. A person who is attracted to both people of their own gender and another gender.
7. Typically any non-LGBT person who supports and stands up for the rights of LGBT people.
8. The sense of "being" male, female, genderqueer, agender, etc. For some people, gender identity is in accord with physical anatomy. 12. A person who is attracted primarily to members of the same sex.
