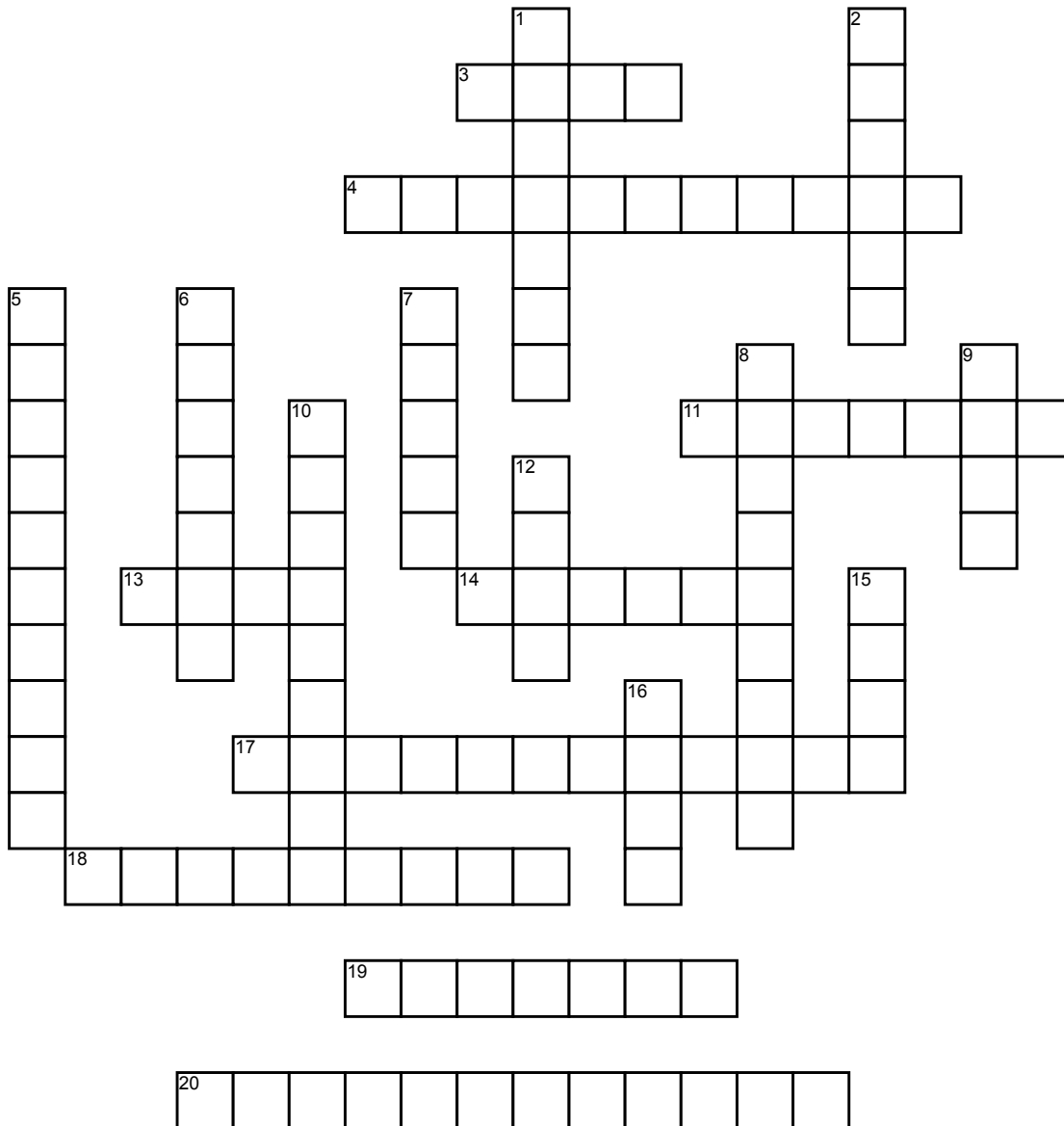

- 3.** A rope of clay or pottery which is made by layering ropes of clay one on top of the other  
**4.** Low firing clay about 1700 degrees. This is the clay we use in class  
**11.** capable of being dissolved in water  
**13.** Heat clay  
**14.** Once fired, unglazed clay  
**17.** Pots which are made using only your hands and simple tools no machines or wheels  
**18.** Coarse high-firing clay. Has lots of grog in it to make it rough

- 19.** Very dry brittle and chalky clay

- 20.** Half dry clay this is best stage for carve and fettle

- 1.** Functional containers made of clay

- 2.** Pieces of broken pottery that has fired

- 5.** Red earthenware clay red flower pots are an example of Terra Cotta clay

- 6.** To rework dry clay to break it up; soak it, dry it, wedge it, use it again

- 7.** Pottery which is made by pinching clay between thumbs and forefingers

- 8.** White, highest firing clay very fine, slick clay

- 9.** Flat piece of clay or pottery which is made from rolled out sheets of clay.

- 10.** Dry, (bonedry) unfired clay projects that will be fired

- 12.** Liquid clay for decoration, casting, and joining clay.

- 15.** tiny bit of hard fired clay, looks like sand

- 16.** An earthy substance composed of various minerals.
