

- **4.** Low firing clay about 1700 degrees. This is the clay we use in class
- **11.** capable of being dissolved in water

- **17.** Pots which are made using only your hands and simple tools no machines or wheels
- **18.** Coarse high-firing clay. Has lots of grog in it to make it rough

- **19.** Very dry brittle and chalky clay
- **20.** Half dry clay this is best stage for carve and fettle

- **1.** Functional containers made of clay
- **2.** Pieces of broken pottery that has fired
- **5.** Red earthenware clay red flower pots are an example of Terra Cotta clay
- **6.** To rework dry clay to break it up; soak it, dry it, wedge it, use it again

- **7.** Pottery which is made by pinching clay between thumbs and forefingers
- **8.** White, highest firing clay very fine, slick clay
- **9.** Flat piece of clay or pottery which is made from rolled out sheets of clay.
- **10.** Dry, (bonedry) unfired clay projects that will be fired
- **12.** Liquid clay for decoration, casting, and joining clay.
- **15.** tiny bit of hard fired clay, looks like sand
