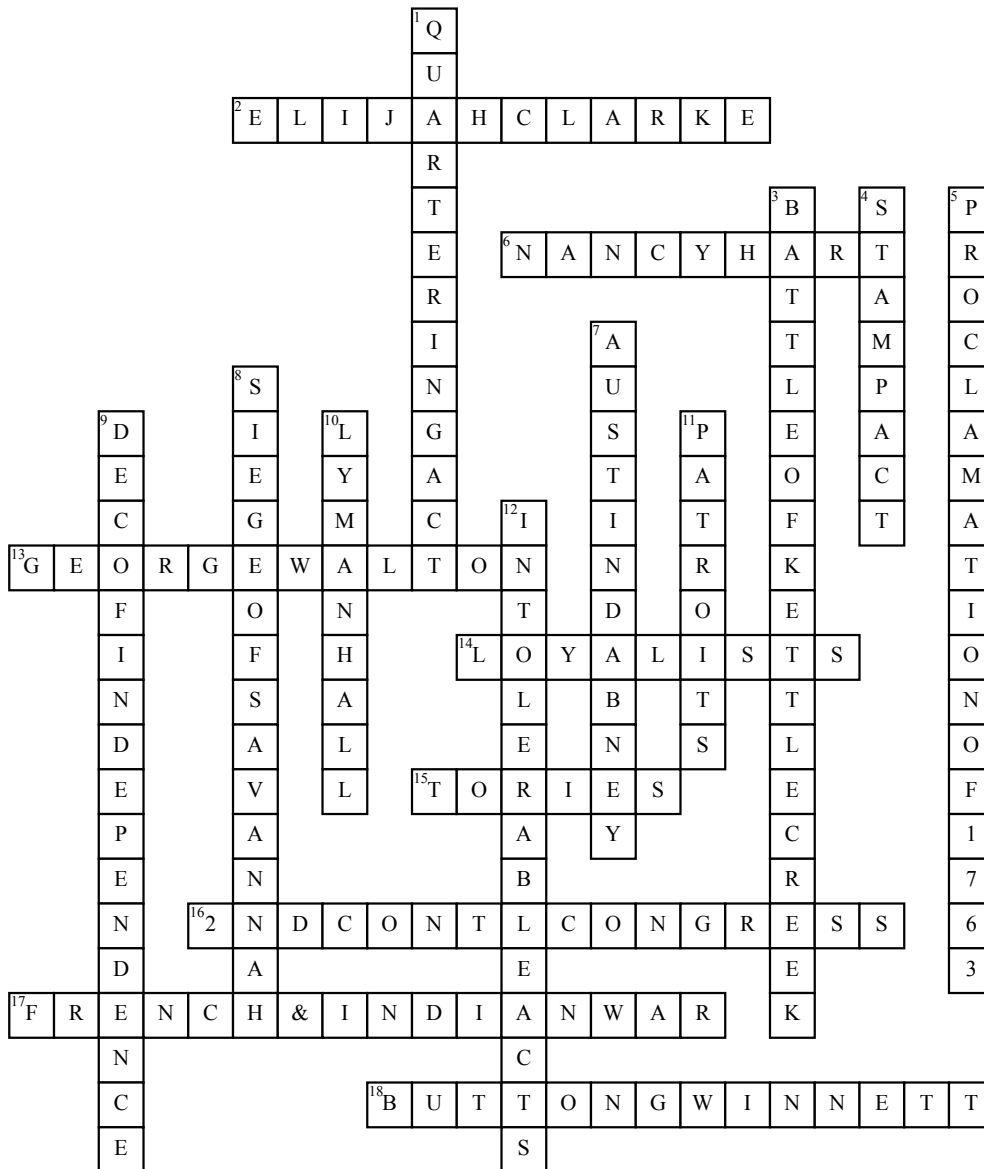


# American Revolution

 13. A man who was 3rd to sign the Declaration and fought in the war as a patriot colonel & was wounded and captured but released and elected governor of GA

 16. The second meeting that representatives from the colonies came together and adopted the Declaration of Independence

1. An act that requires colonists to provide housing for British soldiers without compensation  
 3. A Patriot militia surprised attacked the British soldiers and was a big victory for the Patriots  
 4. An act enforced by the king that put a tax on paper goods to punish the colonists  
 5. A prohibition to build any settlements beyond the Appalachian Mountains

7. A GA slave who fought alongside the patriots during the Battle of Kettle Creek & was paid for his freedom b/c of his bravery  
 8. Second bloodiest battle of the American revolution, the Patriots attempt to regain control of the city and was a dismal failure  
 9. A document that declares the colonies were free from British rule & were now 13 separate colonies  
 10. A man who was a minister & a doctor who also signed the Declaration and was elected governor in 1783 and was instrumental in founding U.G.A  
 11. Name given to settlers who supported independence (also known as "Whigs")  
 12. King George III order to punish colonists with series of laws called the Coercive Acts.
