
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Chapter 4- Integumentary System (Disease and Disorders)

- **4.** Any visible change in tissue resulting from injury or disease. It is a broad term that includes sores, wounds, ulcers, and tumors.
- **6.** Inflammation of the skin and subcutaneous tissue caused by infection, characterized by redness, swelling, and fever
- 7. Fungal infection of the skin, that may infect keratin of the skin, hair, and nails. (also called ringworm)
- **9.** injury with no break in the skin, characterized by pain, swelling, and discoloration (also called a bruise)
- 10. Localized collection of pus
- 11. Torn, ragged-edged wound

- 1. death of tissue caused by loss of blood supply followed by bacterial invasion (a form of necrosis)
- **2.** Chronic skin condition producing red lesions covered with silvery scales.
- **3.** Disease characterized by chronic hardening (induration) of the connective tissue of the skin and other body organs.
- **5.** noninfectious, inflammatory skin disease characterized by redness, blisters, scabs, and itching.
- **8.** Scraping away of the skin by mechanical process
