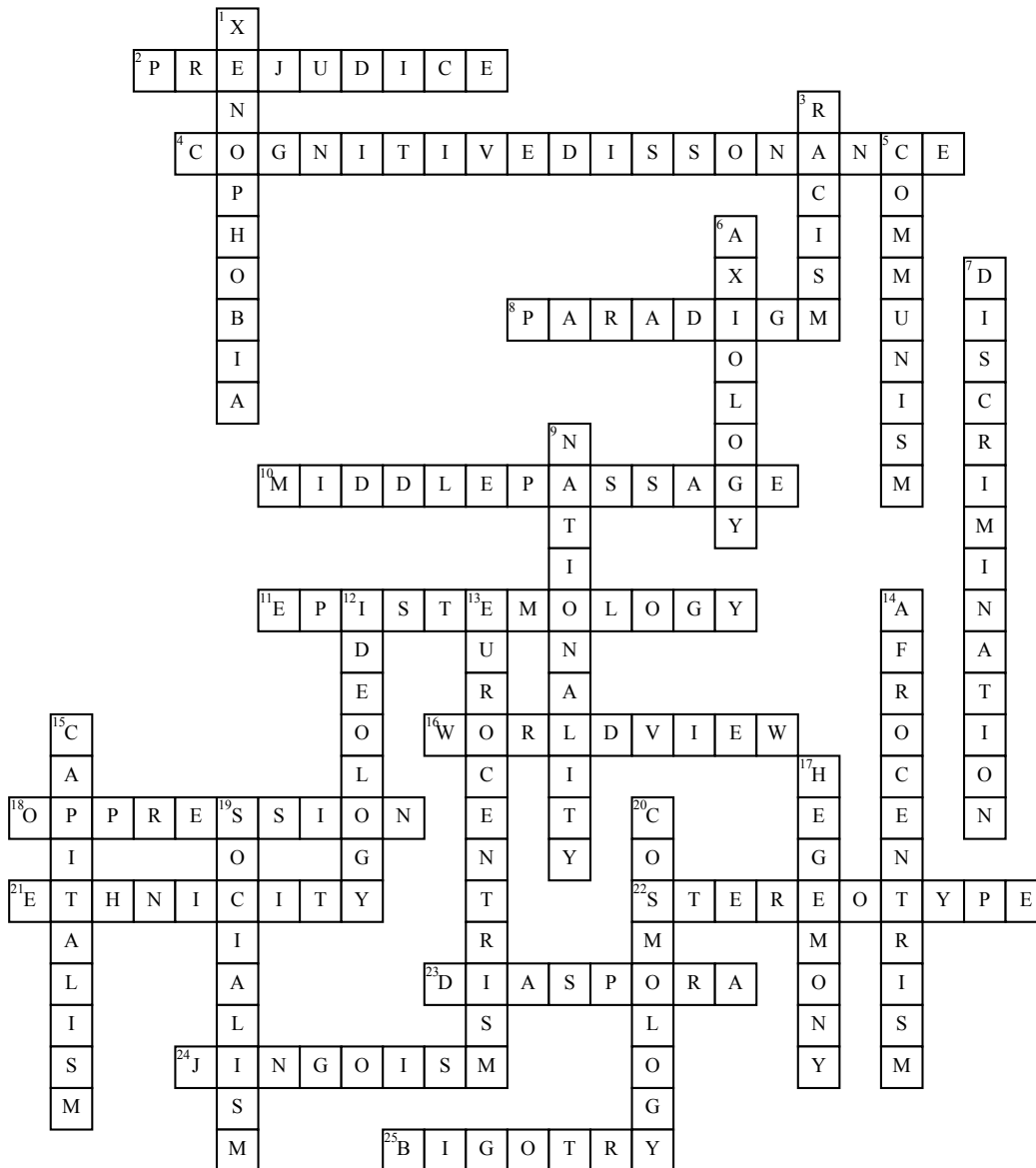

4. the state of having inconsistent thoughts, beliefs, or attitudes, especially as relating to behavioral decisions and attitude change.

8. a typical example or pattern of something; a model.

10. the sea journey undertaken by slave ships from West Africa to the West Indies.

11. the theory of knowledge, especially with regard to its methods, validity, and scope. Epistemology is the investigation of what distinguishes justified belief from opinion.

16. a particular philosophy of life or conception of the world.

18. prolonged cruel or unjust treatment or control.

21. the fact or state of belonging to a social group that has a common national or cultural tradition.

22. a widely held but fixed and oversimplified image or idea of a particular type of person or thing.

23. the dispersion of the African American People from Africa.

24. extreme patriotism, especially in the form of aggressive or warlike foreign policy.

6. the study of the nature of value and valuation, and of the kinds of things that are valuable.

7. the unjust or prejudicial treatment of different categories of people or things, especially on the grounds of race, age, or sex.

9. an ethnic group forming a part of one or more political nations.

12. a system of ideas and ideals, especially one which forms the basis of economic or political theory and policy.

13. is a worldview centered on or biased towards Western civilization.

14. regarding African or black culture as preeminent.

15. an economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state.

17. Leadership or dominance, especially by one country or social group over others.

19. a political and economic theory of social organization which advocates that the means of production, distribution, and exchange should be owned or regulated by the community as a whole.

20. the science of the origin and development of the universe. Modern astronomy is dominated by the Big Bang theory, which brings together observational astronomy and particle physics.
