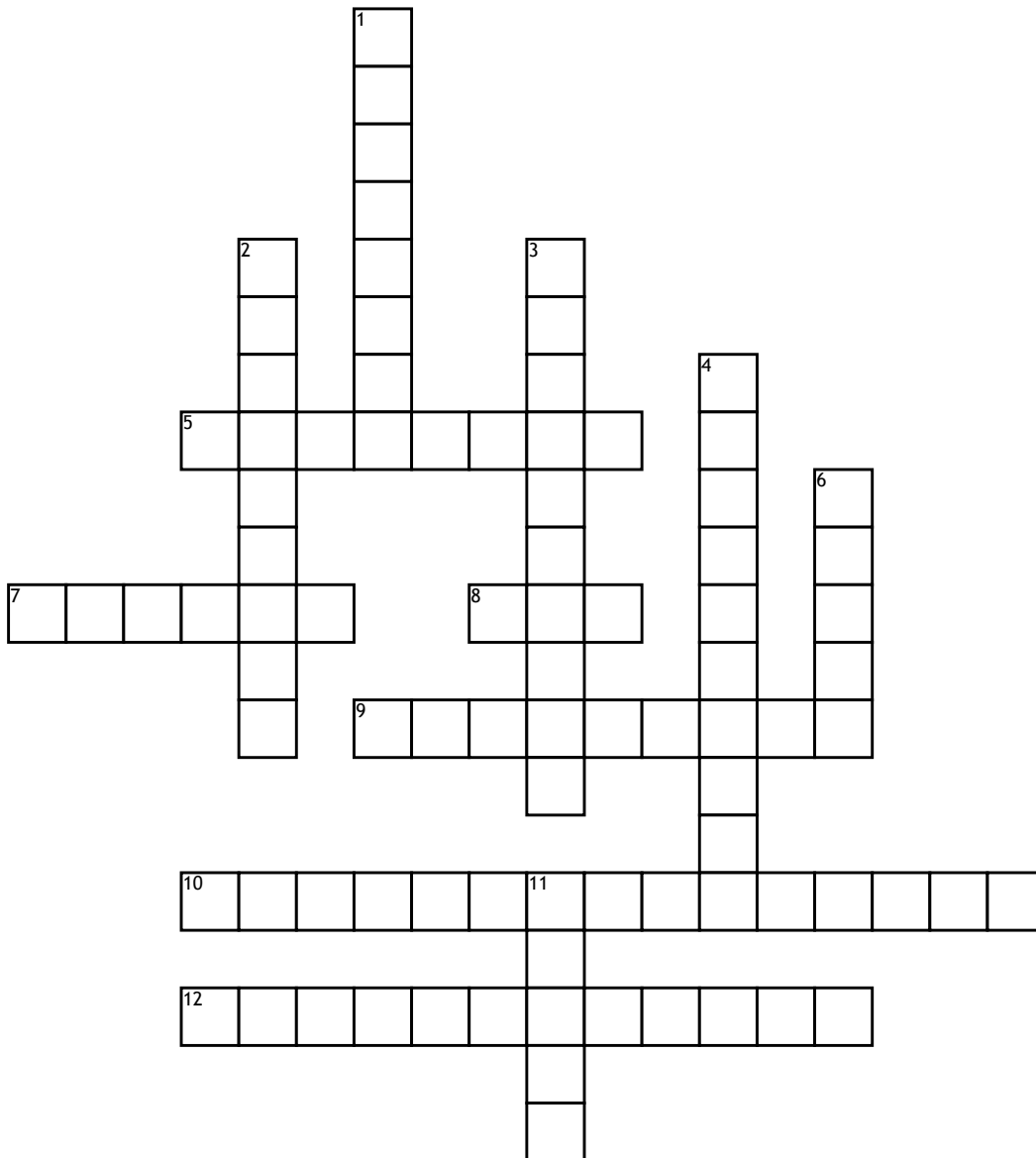


Forms of Contamination
