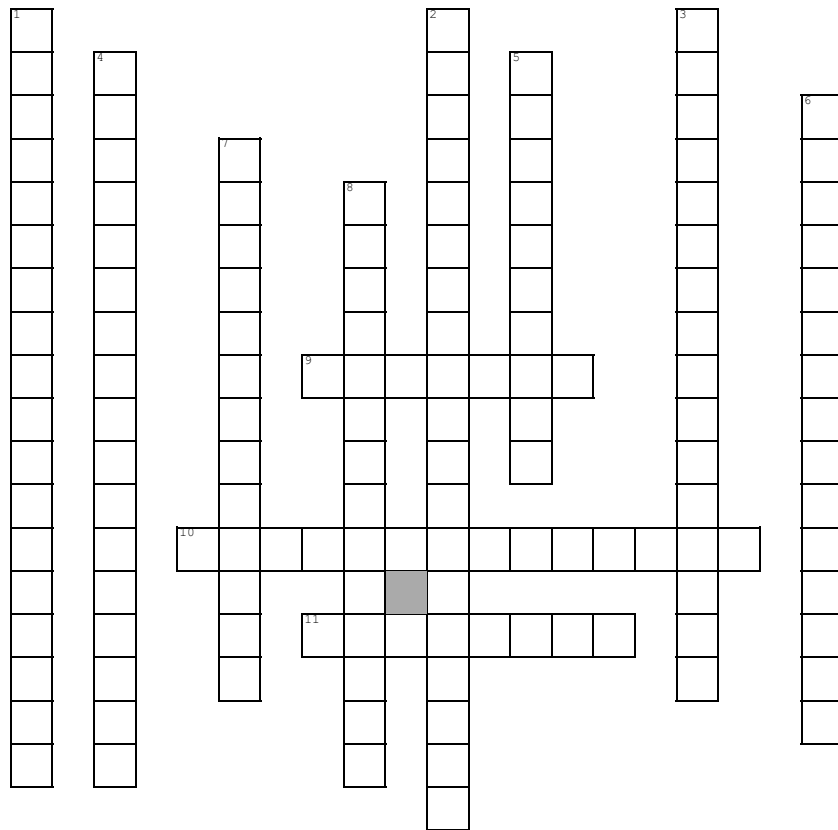


Logical Fallacies

9. idea is dismissed because of who the source is
 10. someone is asked to choose between two ideas
 11. misrepresents a position to make it sound weaker

1. idea must be true because it is the popular opinion
 2. an assumption one makes based on insufficient evidence or biased information
 3. the reasoner begins with what they are trying to end with
 4. authority figure affirms incoherent proposition
 5. fallacy of distraction
 6. An argument is given from which a perfectly valid and sound conclusion may be drawn, yet the stated conclusion is something else
 7. falsely assumes that one thing leads to another
 8. A question with a false, disputed, or question-begging presupposition.
