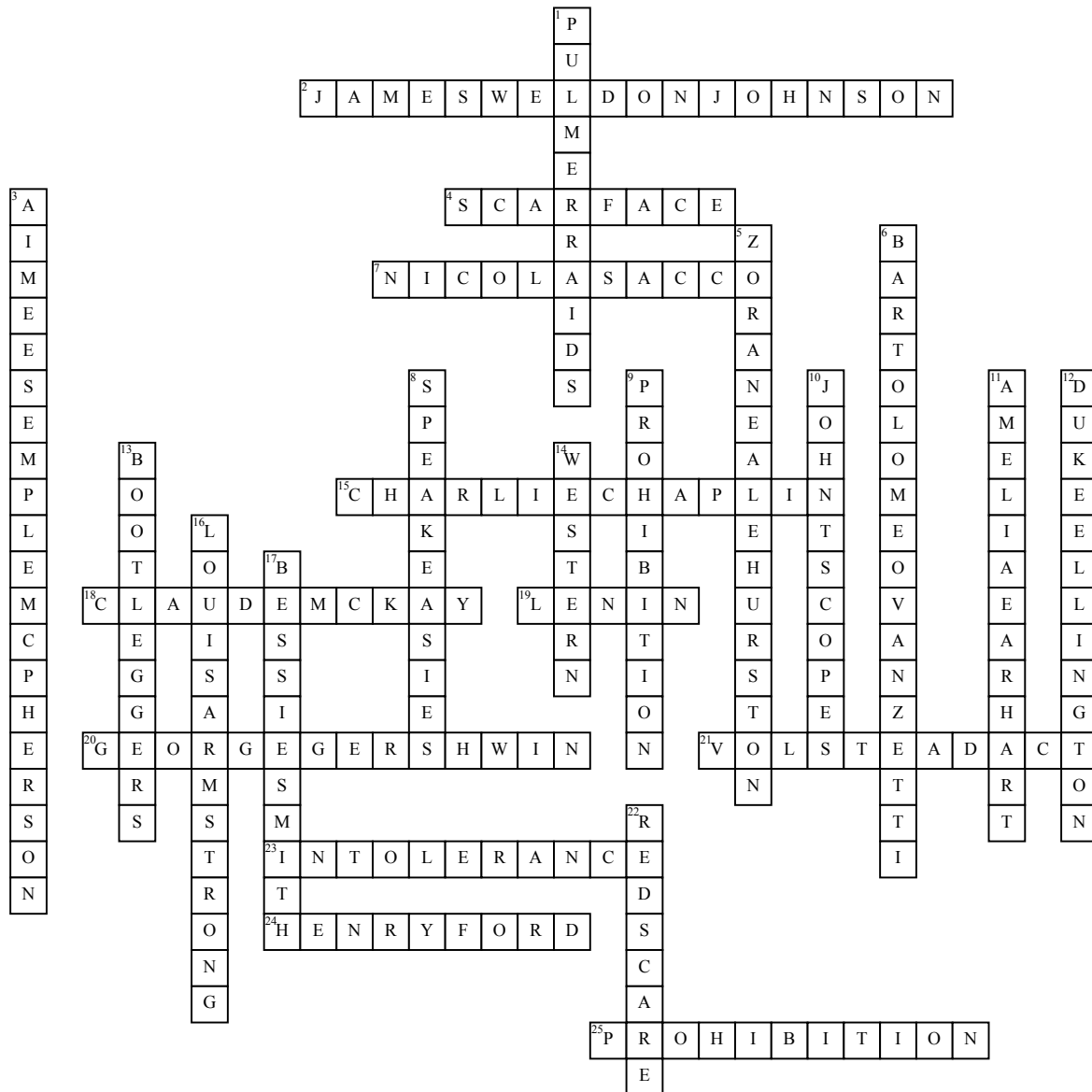


Mr. Moore's Crossword Puzzle
