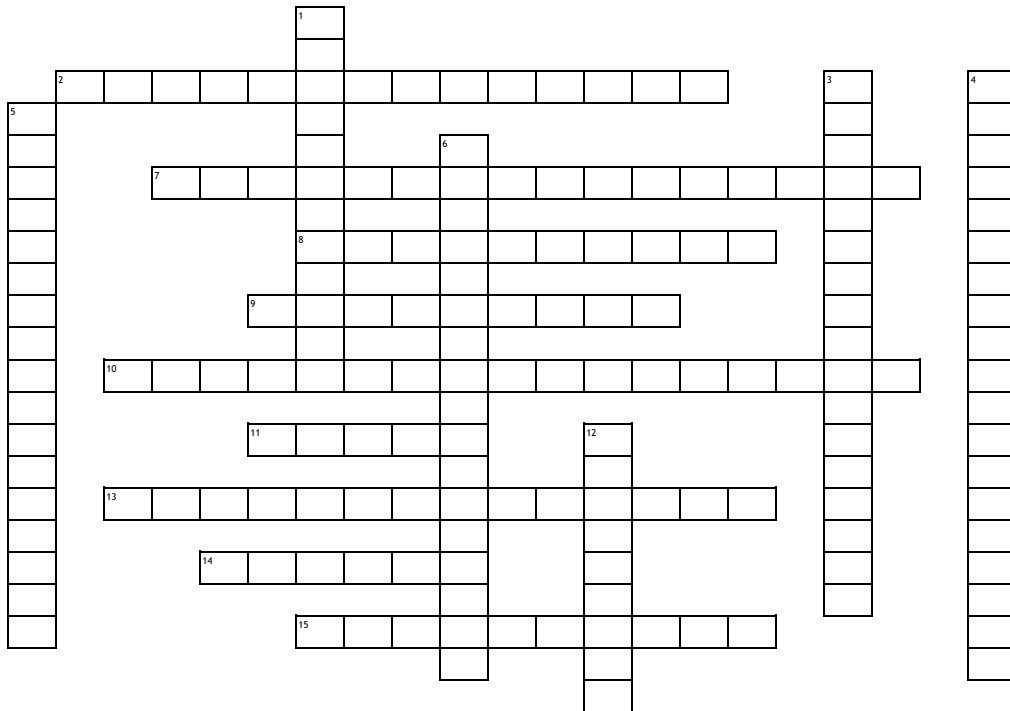

6. is a measurement of population per unit area or unit volume - usually measured per 1000.
