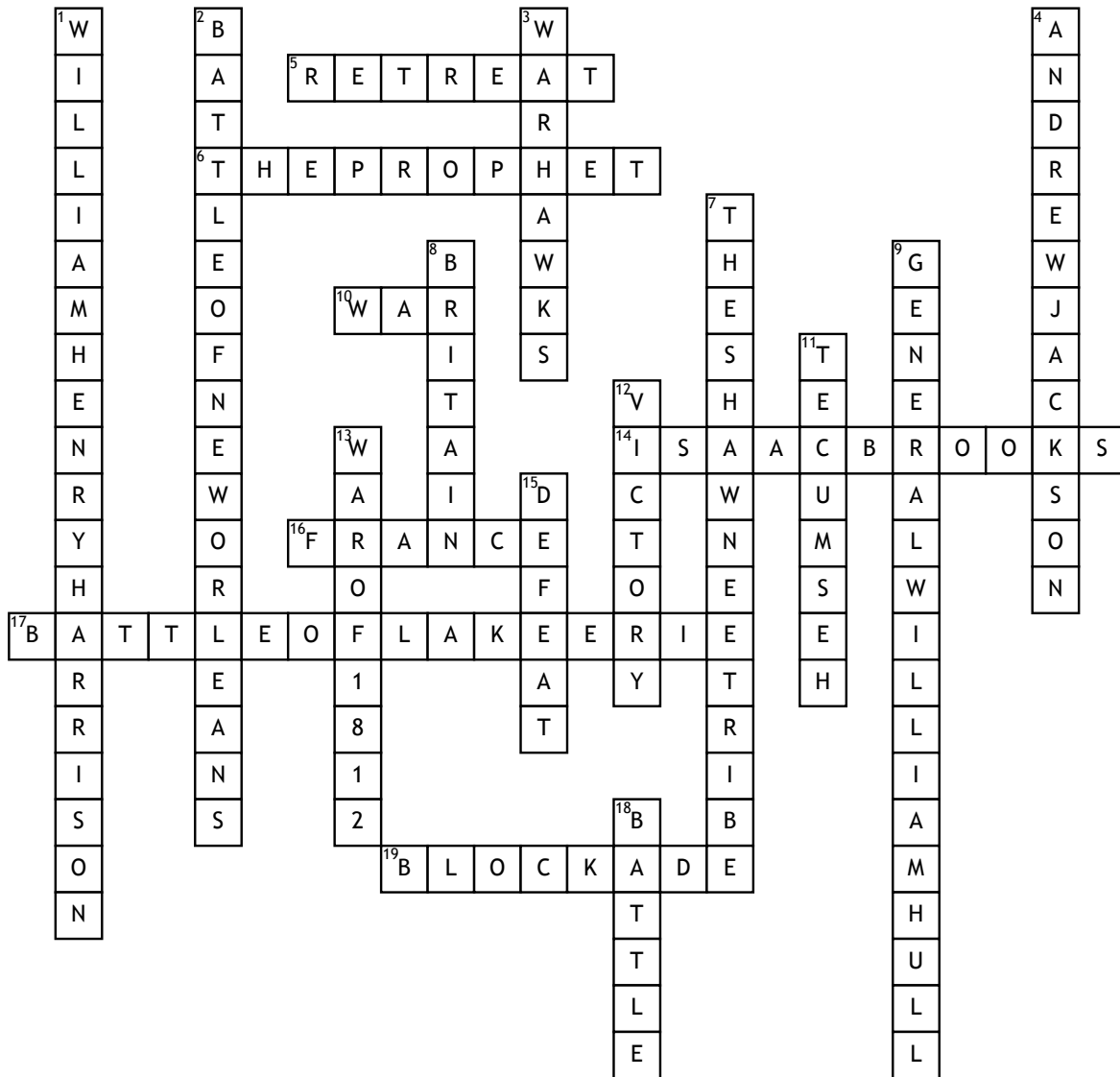

7. a tribe led by Tecumseh.

8. Defeated France in 1814.

9. best remembered for surrendering Fort Detroit to the British on August 16, 1812 following the Siege of Detroit.

11. a Native American leader of the Shawnee and a large tribal confederacy which opposed the United States during Tecumseh's War and became an ally of Britain in the War of 1812.

13. conflict fought between the United States and Great Britain over British violations of U.S. maritime rights. It ended with the exchange of ratification of the Treaty of Ghent.
