
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Textile Terms To Know

- 2. The threads that run parallel to the selvedge
- **3.** The crosswise threads of the fabric. The true bias makes a 45° angle with the straight threads and is stretchy
- **6.** The strong outside edge of a piece of fabric
- 7. A special type of cotton used for sewing
- **10.** The cloth formed from yarns being woven or knitted together
- **11.** The raised surface of a fabric that may pick up the light differently when held in various positions and traps

Down

- 1. The raw material (single thread) such as cotton, wool, or silk which is spun into a yarn
- **4.** Thin or thick yarns are twisted together to varying thicknesses, especially common in wool
- **5.** The threads that run from selvedge to selvedge, across the width of the fabric
- **8.** A group of fibres spun together to make a long strand suitable for making into material (fabric)
- **9.** Usually indicated by an arrow on patterns to show the direction to place them on the fabric
