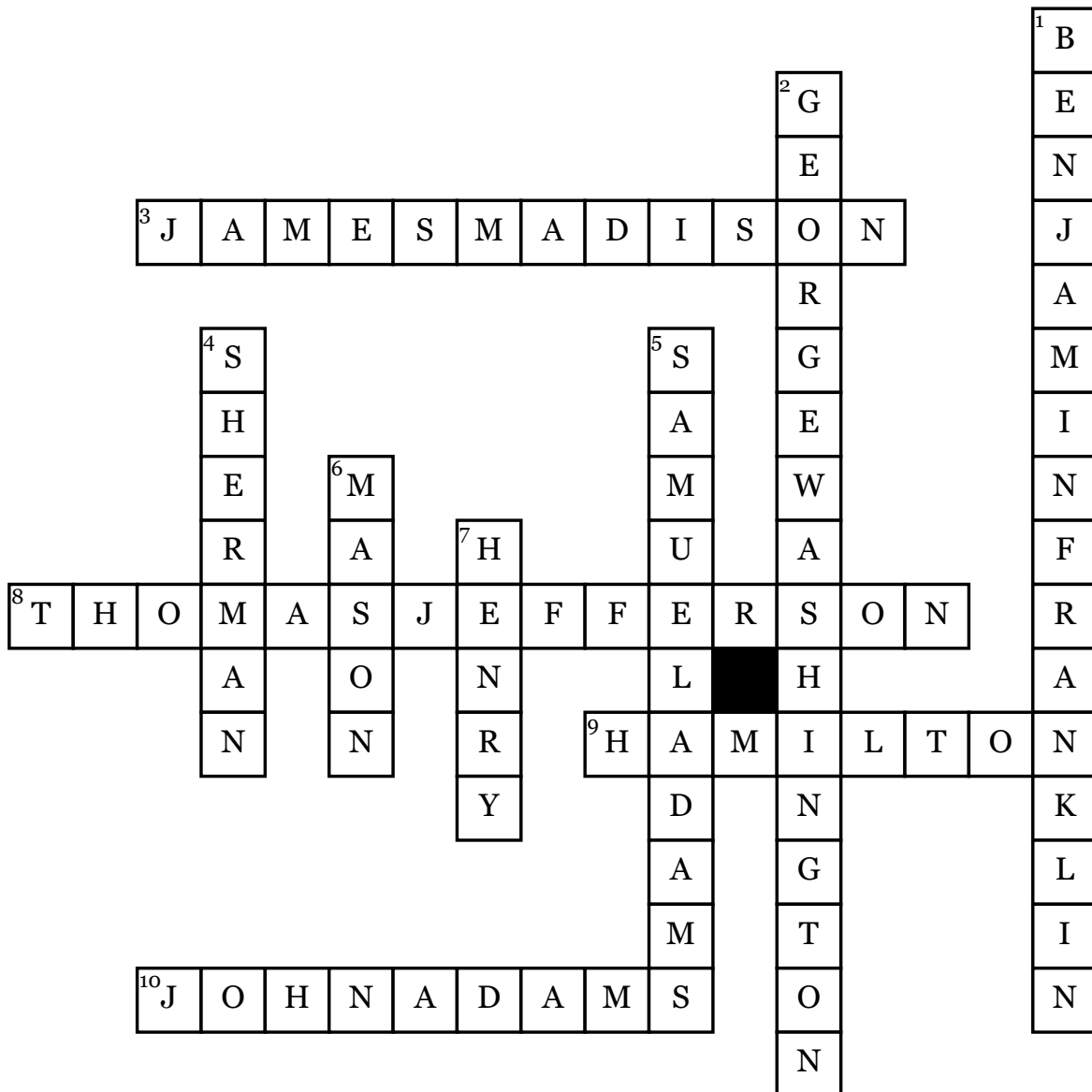

**3.** Representing Virginia, became the chief recorder of information (took notes and read books based on government for meeting; how we know the information about the Constitutional Convention in present day) Known as the "Father of the Constitution"

**8.** A Virginia delegate elected to the Second Continental Congress who wrote the Declaration of Independence in 1776

**9.** In 1777, Hamilton became General George Washington's assistant, in 1788, he convinced New Yorkers to agree to ratify the U.S. Constitution; present through the signing of the Constitution \*(Alexander ...)

**10.** A Massachusetts Patriot who helped write the Declaration of Independence and attended the First Continental Congress in Philadelphia as a Massachusetts delegate

**1.** Lent his wit and wisdom toward the convention; oldest delegate at the Constitutional Convention

**2.** was the first President of the United States, the Commander-in-Chief of the Continental Army during the American Revolutionary War, and one of the Founding Fathers of the United States (President of teh Constitutional Convention)

**4.** A drafter and signer of the Declaration of Independence; longtime member of the Continental Congress, helped to draw up the Articles of Confederation, and served as one of the most important members of the Constitutional Convention in 1787,also, one of the strongest proponents of the new Constitution; dubbed the Great Compromise \*(Roger ...)

**5.** Appointed as a Massachusetts delegate/representative to the Continental Congress until 1781, and a passionate advocate of independence from Britain; in 1776, as a delegate to the Continental Congress, he signed the Declaration of Independence

**6.** a Virginia delegate to the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia, where, he proved to be vastly influential in the composition of the Constitution; rallied against ratification of the final draft of the U.S. Constitution; an American patriot who participated in the American Revolution and the Constitutional Convention and who was influential in penning the Bill of Rights \*(George ...)

**7.** Caused the Bill of Rights to be adopted as part of the U.S. Constitution, famous for his saying "Give me liberty or give me death"; Virginia Patriot who called for independence \*(Patrick ...)
