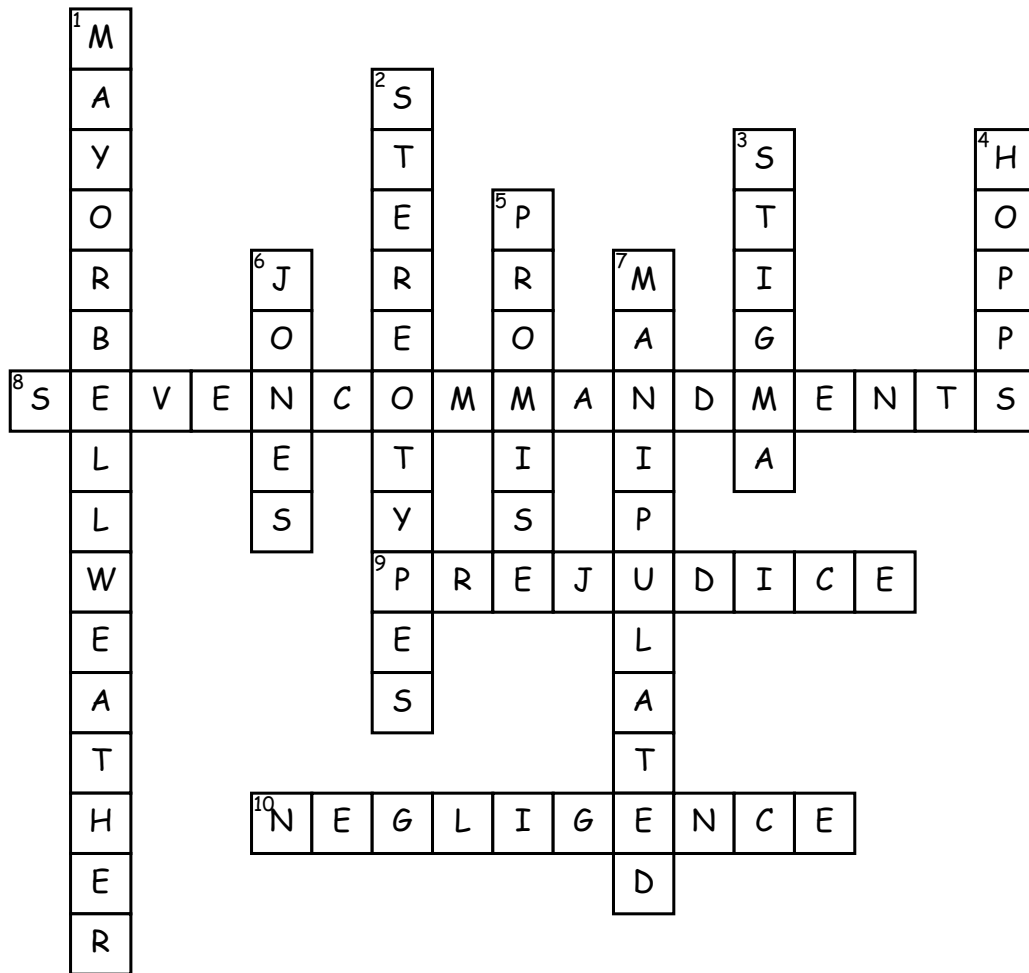


Animal Farm Vs. Zootopia Crossword
