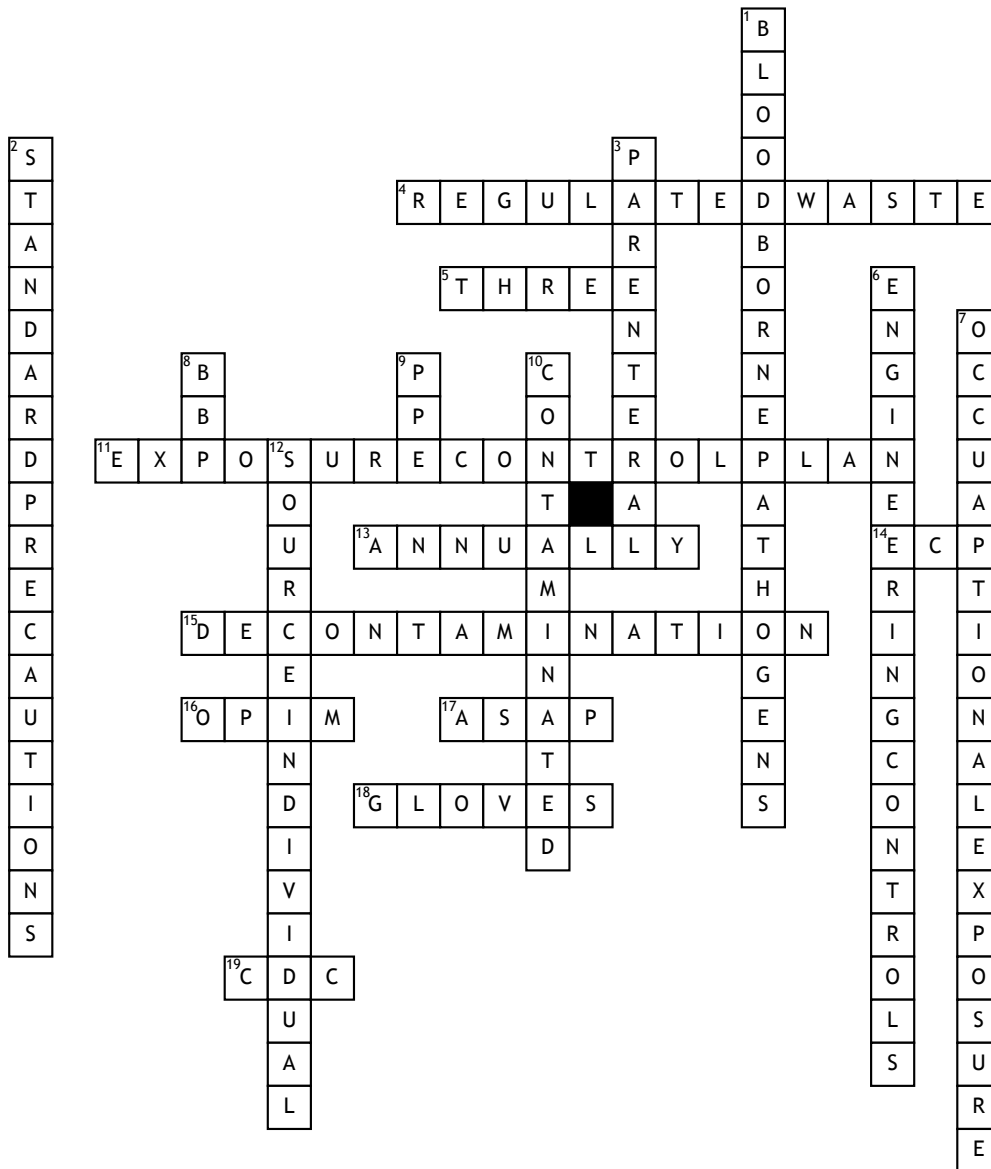

1. pathogens such as HBV, HIV
