

- **13.** A resist- dyeing process that involves applying wax in a pattern on cloth
- **14.** Enables a facade to be non- load bearing

- **3.** A textile weaving process that creates a pattern with a water- stained appearance
- **4.** A woodworking joinery technique with wedge- shaped units that interlock with each other

- **7.** A decorative surface ornamentation with intertwining vines, flowers, and geometric forms
- **8.** A nearly flat sculpture on a surface
- **10.** A late 19th- and early 20th-century international style; Designs were inspired by organic forms, flowing curves, and flora
