2. (1887-1954) "Father of Bloodstain Identification" -He developed a procedure for determining the blood type (A, B, AB, or O) of a dried blood stain.

4. (1877-1966) - "Father of the crime lab" - In 1910, he started the 1st crime lab in an attic of a police station. -With few tools, he quickly became known world-wide to forensic scientists & criminal investigators & eventually founded the institute of criminalistics in France. -His most important contribution was the "Locard's Exchange Principle"

6. (1847-1915) "Father of Forensic Publications" -Wrote the book on applying all the different science disciplines to the field of criminal investigation.

7. (1858-1946) "Father of Document Examination" -His work led to the acceptance of documents as scientific evidence by the courts.

8. (1916-2002) "Father of Microscopic Forensics" - He developed & applied his microscope techniques to examine evidence in countless court cases. 9. (1822-1911) "Father of Fingerprinting" -Developed fingerprinting as a way to uniquely identify individuals.

10. (1866-1957) "Father of Ballistics" -Developed the technique to examine bullets, using a comparison microscope to determine whether or not a particular gun fired the bullets.

1. -Conducted experiments in mixing blood and serum of different persons and discovered that blood cells can be divided into groups. -Developed the ABO blood-typing system currently in use today.

3. "Father of the FBI" - Director of Federal Bureau of Investigation during the 1930's -Hoover's leadership spanned 48yrs & 8 presidential administrations. His reign covered Prohibition, the Great Depression, WWII, the Korean War, the Cold War, & the Vietnam War. -He organized a national Laboratory to offer forensic services to all law enforcement agencies in the U.S. VERY CONTROVERSIAL- -He exceeded & abused his authority with unjustified investigations and illegal wiretaps based on political beliefs rather than suspected criminal activity FBI directors are now limited to 10-year term

5. French medical jurist who developed the idea of determining cause of death. -Also helped developed procedure to determine if death was suicide or murder.
