

## Parts of a Theater

- **3.** The middle of the playing area
- **7.** Short, wide drapes used to conceal lighting instruments and fly space
- 8. The area in the theater where the audience sits
- **10.** The stage area on the right (from the actor's perspective)
- **13.** A type of performance space that was not originally designed for theatrical performance
- **16.** A type of stage that can be rearranged to become any of the other types of stage
- **18.** The stage area on the left (from the actor's perspective)
- 20. The steelwork above the stage from which lighting instruments and draperies are hung

- **21.** A collaborative art form involving a performance or presentation of a work of art for an audience
- **22.** A type of stage where the audience sits on only one side of the stage
- **23.** The area of the stage behind the proscenium and drapery that is hidden from the audience
- **24.** The area between the stage and the audience where the orchestra plays **Down**
- 1. The stage area farthest from the audience
- **2.** The areas immediately offstage to the left and right of the stage
- **4.** A type of stage where the audience sits on three sides of the stage
- **5.** A type of stage where the audience sits on all sides of the stage

- **6.** The stage area closest to the audience
- **9.** The backstage area where the actors wait during performances
- **11.** This type of stage was slanted down towards the audience to aid visibility
- **12.** Room where the light board operator, sound board operator, and stage manager run the show
- **14.** Platforms and walkways above the stage used by technicians to adjust and repair instruments
- 15. Narrow, vertical curtains used to mask the wings and sides of the stage
- 17. The frontmost part of a proscenium stage, in front of the arch and the grand drape
- **19.** A building in which performances are given
