

- 2. Ability of a state to govern its territory free from control of its internal affairs by other states. U.S controls army, laws, and leaders.
- **6.** The system formerly in effect in South Africa that segregated people based upon race. (abolished in the 90s
- **12.** a state whose territory corresponds to that occupied by a ethnicity that has been turned into a nationality. The countries after wwi
- **15.** state that breaks down through conflicts among ethnicities. Ex. Former Yugoslavia
- **16.** States between two opposing nations. Mongolia is \_\_\_\_\_\_ between China and Russia.
- 17. State that contains two or more ethnic groups with traditions of self-determination that agree to coexist peacefully by recognizing each other as distinct nationalities. An example would be the U.K.

- **18.** a part of a country that is separated from the rest of the country and surrounded by foreign territory. Part of Russia is separated by Belarus.
- **19.** a territory that is legally tied to a sovereign state rather than completely independent. Ex. Puerto Rico
- **20.** A border that is straight line on a map dividing two countries. U.S.A. and Canadian border.

- 1. Long and narrow shape. Ex. Chile
- **3.** Follows the distribution of cultural characteristics. Pakistan and India are separated by religion.
- **4.** A state or territory that is small in both size and population. Monaco.
- **5.** Conflict between two or more ethnic groups. Ex. Disputes between Sinhalese and Tamils in Sri Lanka.

- **7.** A boundary that coincides with significant features of the natural landscape. The Saharan desert divides many countries.
- **8.** an area of instability between regions with opposing conflict between ethnicities. Ex. Slovenia between Croatia and Austria
- **9.** a distinct region or community enclosed within a larger territory. Ex. Chinatown in New York
- **10.** State enclosed by land with no direct access to the sea. Ex. Czech Republic.
- 11. The doctrine that irredenta should be controlled by the country to which they are ethnically or historically related. Somalia invading Ethiopia.
- **13.** A politically organized territory that is administered by a sovereign government and is recognized by the international community. A synonym is a country.
- **14.** A sovereign state comprising a city and its immediate surrounding countryside. First developed in Mesopotamia.
