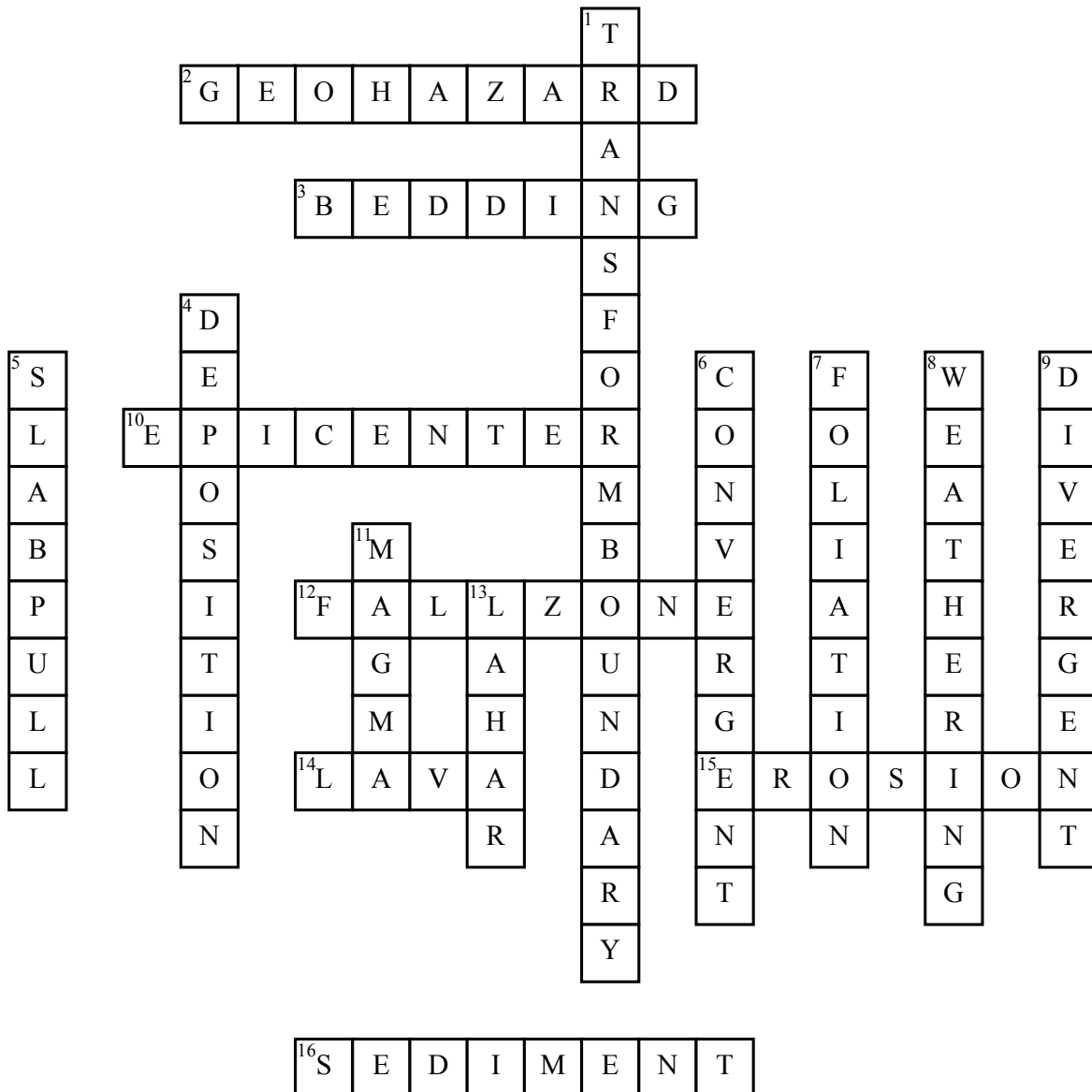


Lithosphere Crossword
