
## Crime scene basics

5. Interview witnesses and consult with the CSI unit. They investigate the crime by following leads provided by witnesses and physical evidence.
7. an impression or mark made on a surface by a person's fingertip, especially as used for identifying individuals from the unique pattern of whorls and lines.

**9.** The first step in analyzing a crime; used to determine the nature of the crime, possible suspects, eyewitness accounts, etc.

**10.** Any physical location in which a crime has occurred or is suspected of having occurred.

## <u>Down</u>

**1.** (Isabelle) person thought to be capable of committing a crime.

**2.** a person harmed, injured, or killed as a result of a crime, accident, or other event or action.

**3.** Typically the first to arrive at a crime scene. They are responsible for securing the scene and detaining persons of interest.

**4.** (Mia) a person associated with suspect that may have committed a crime.

6. Statement of where suspect was at the time of the crime.

**8.** At the crime scene to identify potential evidence, the point of exit, and getting the general layout of the crime scene.
