
Non communicable diseases



<u>Across</u>

9. a respiratory condition marked by spasms in the bronchi of the lungs

11. usually involves the inability to distinguish between shades of red and green.

14. limits bodies ability to process glucose normally

15. causes bone mass to decrease and make bones brittle, mostly found in women

16. a neurodegenerative disease where beta-amyloid plaques build up and kill brain cells. causes memory loss.

<u>Down</u>

1. a painful condition of the hand and fingers caused by compression of a major nerve where it passes over the carpal bones through a passage at the front of the wrist,

2. occurs when mother drinks alcohol during pregnancy and causes birth related defects

3. production of too much thyroxine hormone

4. Manic episodes may include symptoms such as high energy, reduced need for sleep, and loss of touch with reality. Depressive episodes may include symptoms such as low energy, low motivation 5. chromosome defect, causing intellectual impairment and physical abnormalities

6. deficiency of thyroid hormones

7. malignant cell growth in the lung tissue

8. sudden attacks of sleep from abnormal signaling in the brain

10. complete or partial absence of pigment in the skin, hair and eyes

12. the nerve connecting the eye to the brain is damaged, usually due to high eye pressure.

13. ability of the blood to clot is severely reduced, causing the sufferer to bleed severely from even a slight injury
