

**1.** An emancipated slave

**2.** The period after the Civil War in which the states formerly part of the confederacy were brought back into the United States

**8.** Laws passed by Southern states in 1865 and 1866 after the Civil War that had the intent and the effect of restricting African Americans' freedom, and of compelling them to work in a labor economy based on low wages or debt

**9.** Used to deny suffrage from African Americans by Southern State Legislatures
