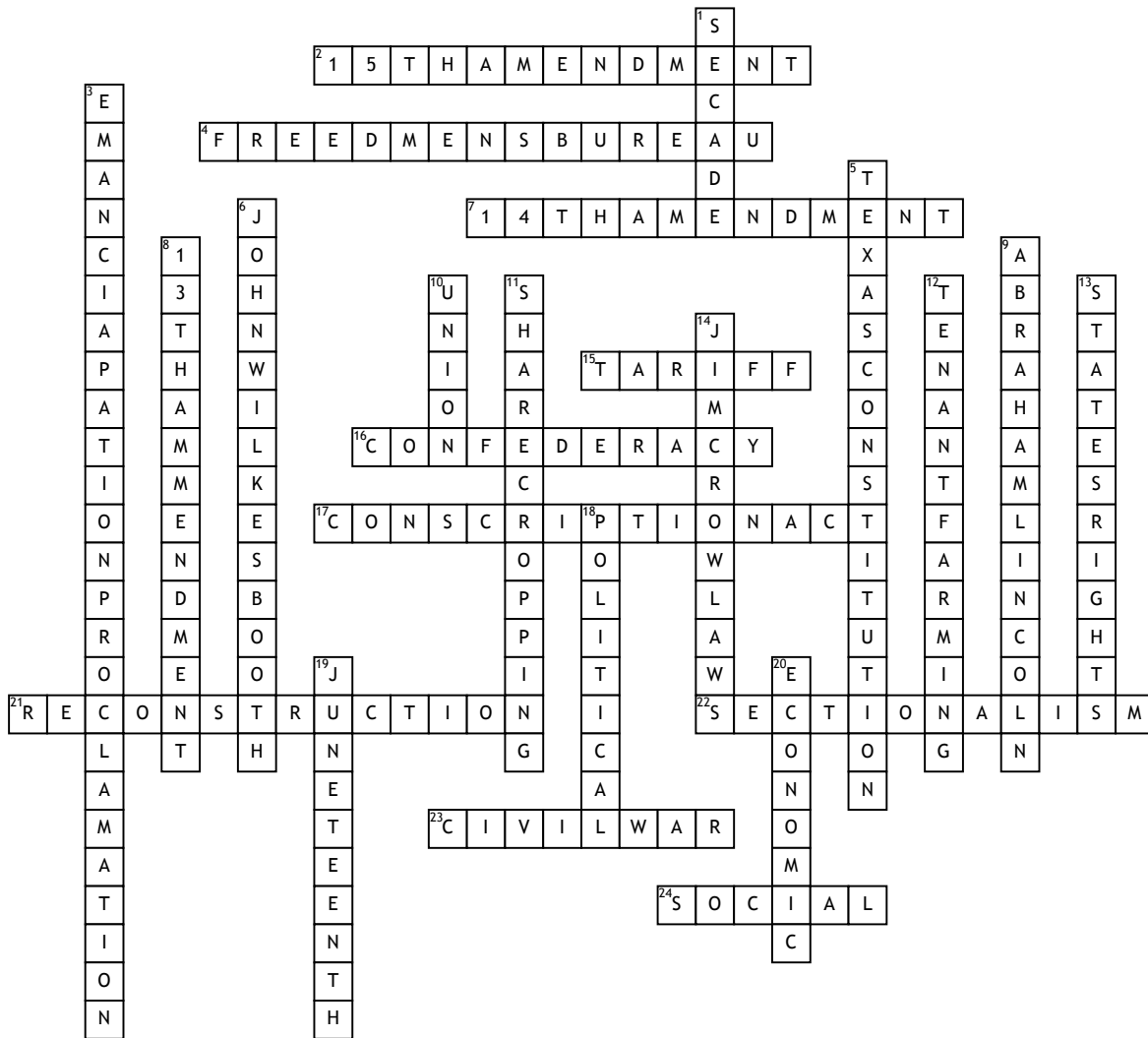

4. Established in 1865 by the national government to provide freed slaves food, shelter, medicine, and opened the first school for African American children.

7. Extended citizenship and due process to all born within, or naturalized to the United States (including formerly-enslaved people and excluding American Indians.)

15. Tax on imported goods from other countries import; to bring in from another country.

16. Southern States that seceded to retain the slavery.

17. Act that made men age 20-45 join the Confederate army or the Union army.

21. Era of rebuilding time for the United States after Civil War. (1865-1877)

22. Most Texans were originally from the South and had connections to friends and families there. Many of these Texans agreed with slavery though most did not hold slaves.
