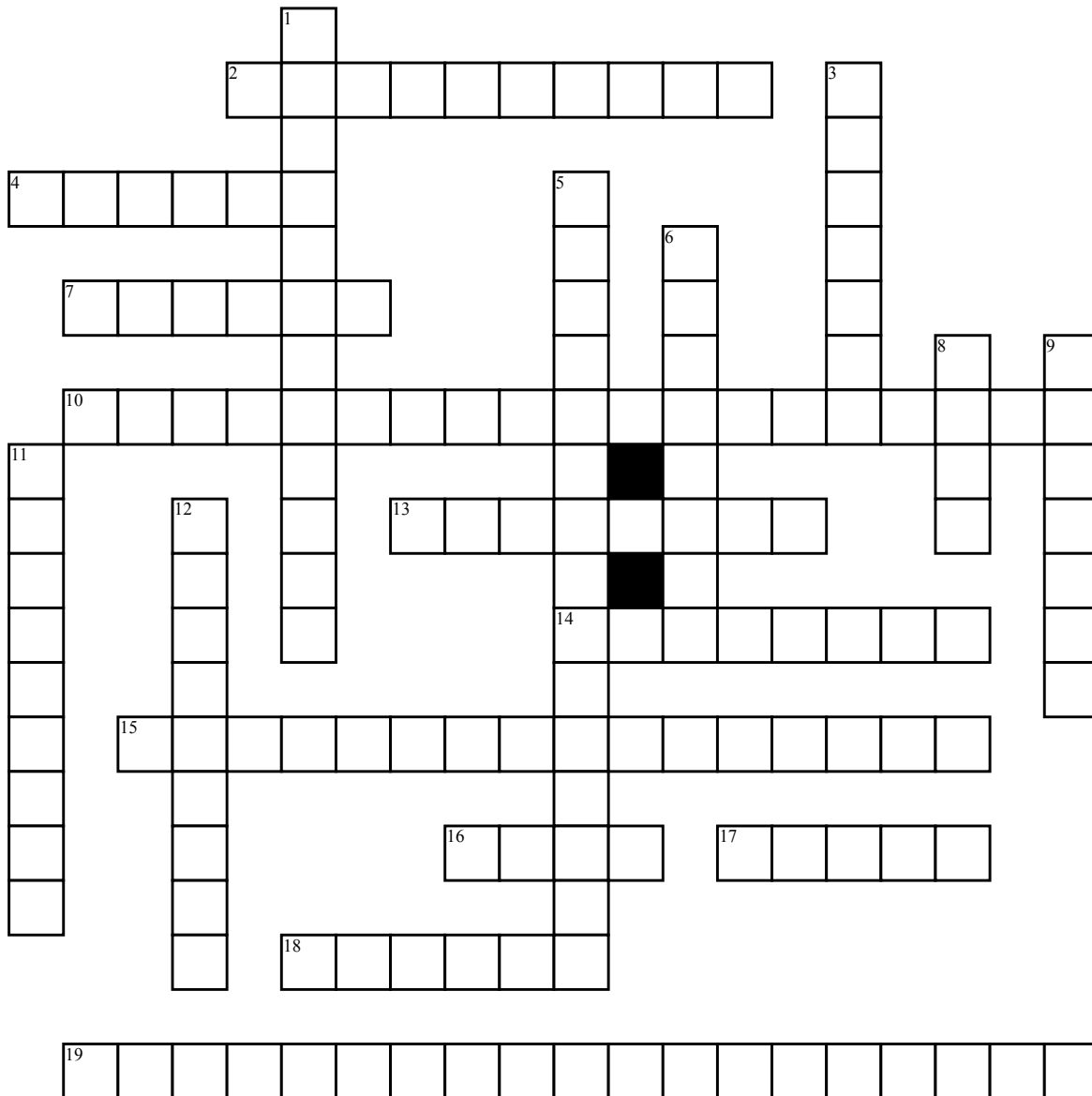

15. a galaxy that has a generally elliptical shape and that has no apparent internal structure or spiral arms called also elliptical compare spiral galaxy

16. A giant ball of hot gas that creates and emits its own radiation through nuclear fusion

17. a celestial body that appears as a fuzzy head usually surrounding a bright nucleus

18. An enormous gravitational bond assemble of the millions or billions of stars

19. a telescope in which a mirror is used to collect and focus light.
