

- 3. The rate at which velocity changes over time; an object accelerates if it's speed, direction, or both change
- 7. The acceleration of an object as produced by a net force is directly proportional to the magnitude of the net force, in the same direction as the net force, and inversely proportional to the mass of the object.
- 8. overall force acting on an object
- **11.** the rate at which someone or something is able to move or operate.
- **13.** a body's relative mass or the quantity of matter contained by it, giving rise to a downward force; the heaviness of a person or thing.
- 14. For every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction. The statement means that in every interaction, there is a pair of forces acting on the two interacting objects. The size of the forces on the first object equals the size of the force on the second object.
- **16.** strength or power exerted upon an object; physical coercion; violence
- **17.** two forces acting in opposite directions on an object, and equal in size
- 1. the resistance that one surface or object encounters when moving over another.
- 2. An object at rest stays at rest and an object in motion stays in motion with the same speed and in the same direction unless acted upon by an unbalanced force.
