

2. One of the two houses of the federal Parliament of Australia, whose Members are elected on a population basis PARLIAMENT

3. A vote exercised by the Speaker or certain committee chairs only when the votes for and against a proposal are equal CASTING

5. The room in which sittings of Parliament are held

7. A year as reckoned for taxing or accounting purposes FINANCIAL9. a system of government by the

whole population or all the eligible members of a state, typically through elected representatives.

11. The upper house of the bicameral Parliament of Australia, the lower house being the House of Representatives.

12. The system of rules which a particular country or community recognizes as regulating the actions of its members and which it may enforce by the imposition of penalties.
13. A formal and organized choice by vote of a person for a political office or other position

15. The head of an elected government; the principal minister of a sovereign or state PRIME **Down**

1. The chief representative of the Crown in a Commonwealth country of which the British monarch is head of state GOVERNOR

6. The second chamber in a two-chamber Parliament; for example the Senate is the upper house in the federal Parliament UPPER
