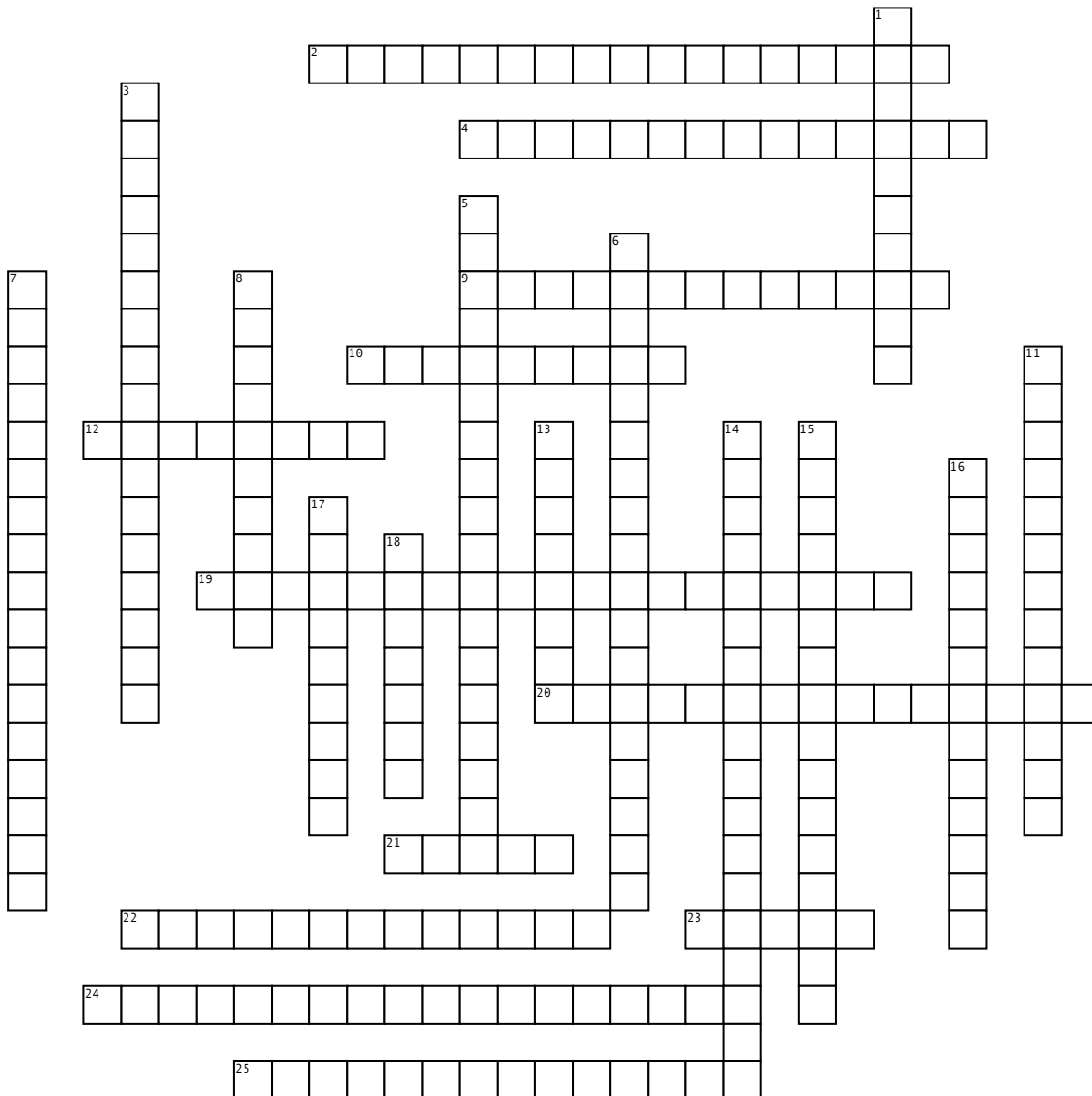

2. Counterbalancing influenced by which an organization or system is regulated- ensuring political power is not concentrated in the hands of individuals/groups.
4. Powers assigned to the states and the people. The 10th Amendment of the U.S Constitution covers these.
9. The right of a government or its agent to expropriate private property for public use, with payment of compensation.
10. The restriction of the arbitrary exercise of power by subordinating it to well-defined/established laws.
12. The right to vote in political elections.
19. The clause in the First Amendment of the US Constitution that prohibits the establishment of religion by congress.
20. Powers granted to the government mostly found in Article One, Section 8 of the Constitution.
21. Make minor changes in a text in order to make it fairer, more accurate/up-to date.

1. The federal principle or system of government.
3. The supremacy clause of the U.S convention establishes that the Constitution covers the subject of the reserved powers.
5. Refers to the section of the First Amendment- 'Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion.'
6. An act of vesting the legislative, executive, and judicial powers of government in separate bodies.
7. A political system where the legalized force is restricted through delegated and enumerated powers.
8. Fair treatment through the normal judicial system, especially as a citizen's entitlement.
11. A legal document authorizing a police officer or other official to enter/search a premises.

13. A preliminary or preparatory statement/information.

14. Principle that the authority of a state/government is created/sustained by the consent of its people.

15. Powers that are shared by both the State and Federal government.
