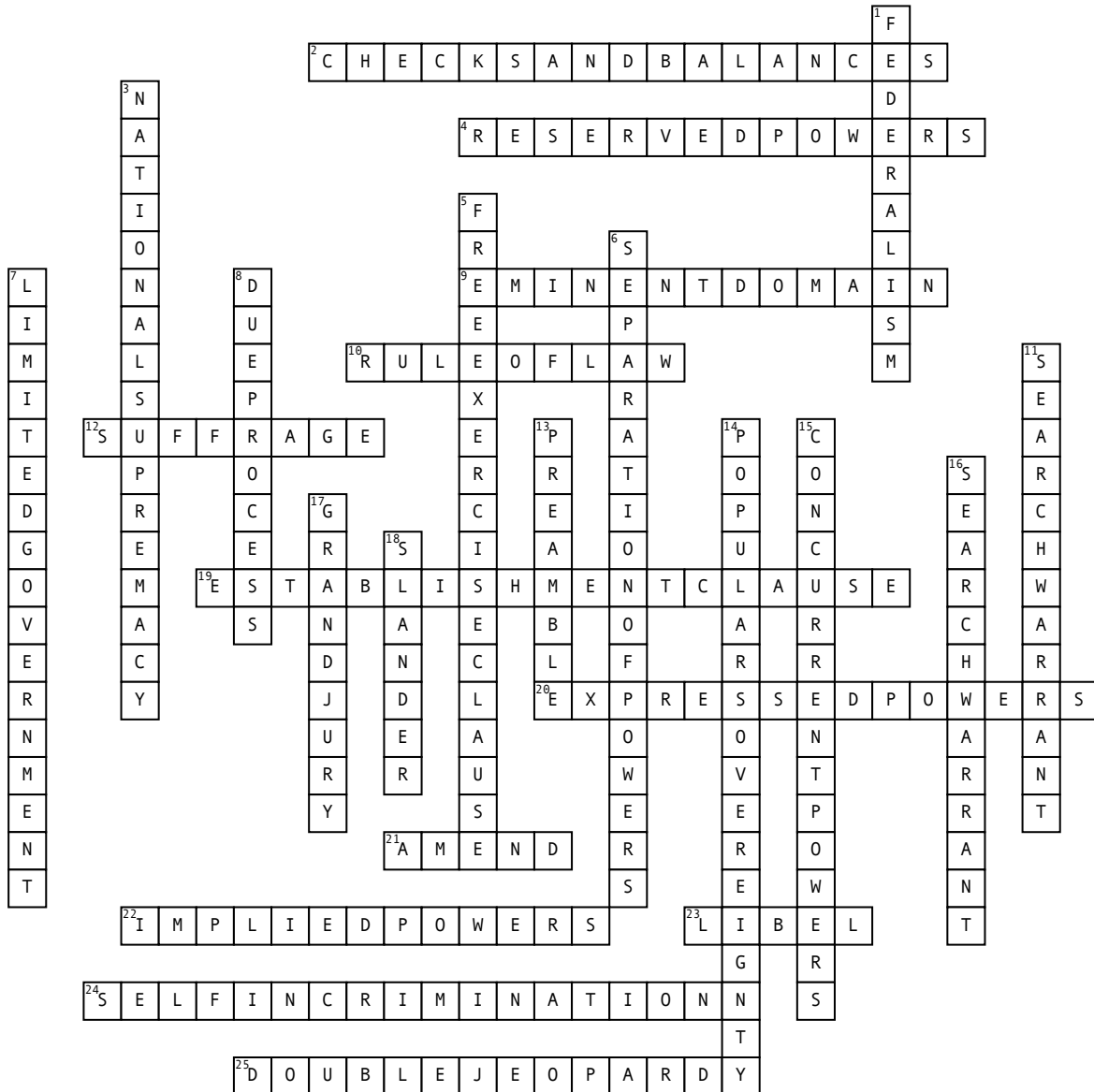


Constitution Crossword

- 1. The federal principle or system of government.

 - 6. An act of vesting the legislative, executive, and judicial powers of government in separate bodies.
 - 7. A political system where the legalized force is restricted through delegated and enumerated powers.
