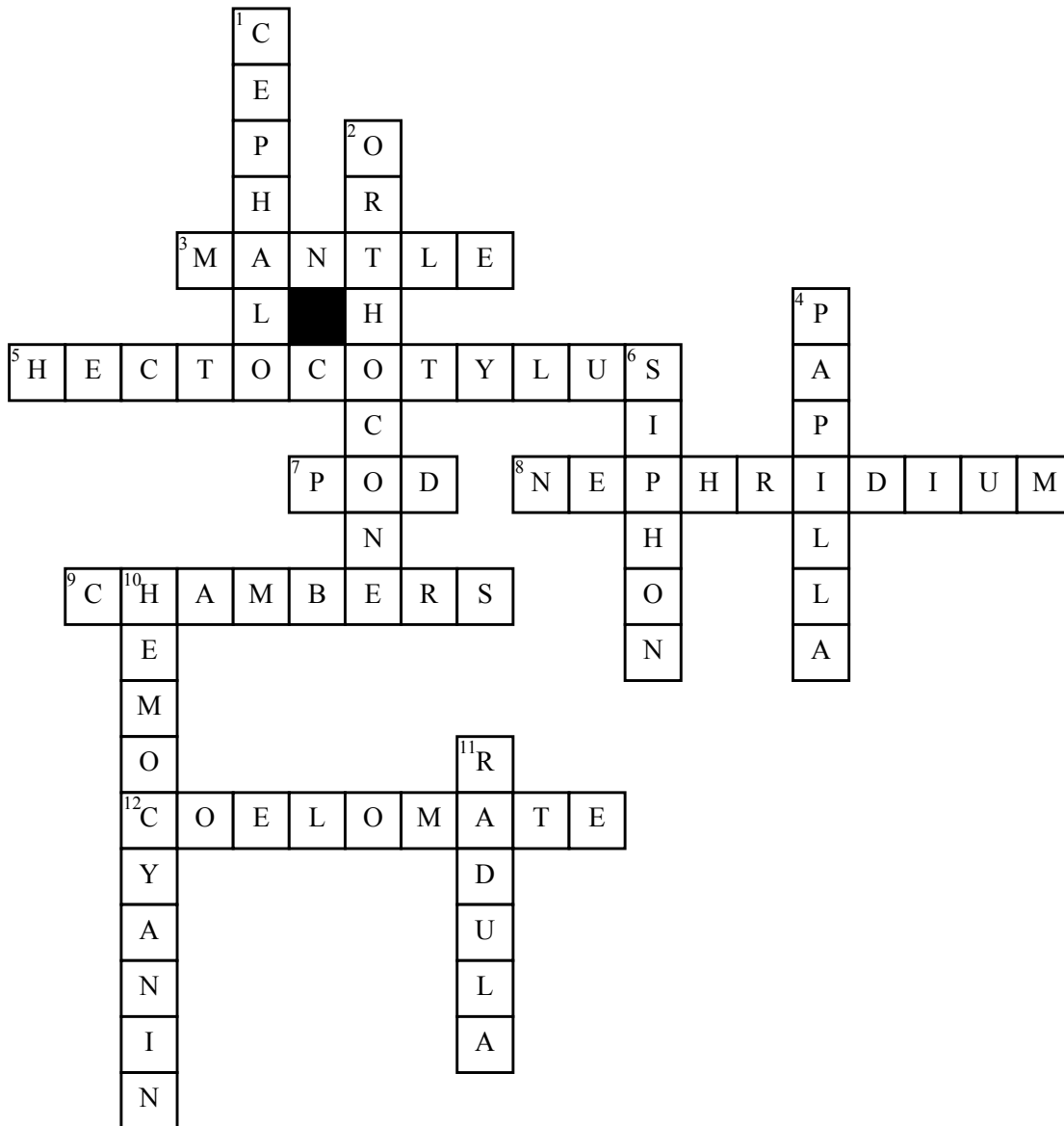


Phylum Mollusca

3. A highly muscled structure that houses all of the animal's organs

5. a modified arm used by male octopuses and some other cephalopods to transfer sperm to the female

7. Greek for foot

8. a tubule open to the exterior that acts as an organ of excretion

9. Divisions within the spiraled shell of the nautilus that they live in throughout their life

12. (adjective form of coelom) the body cavity located between the intestinal canal and the body wall

1. Greek for head

2. Straight external shell from the cephalopods

4. a taste and smell organ located near the eye of an octopus

6. The tubular portion of the octopus that can draw water in and out of its body using its muscular mantle

10. a protein containing copper, responsible for transporting oxygen in the blood plasma of arthropods and mollusks

11. a rasp-like structure of tiny teeth used for scraping food particles off a surface and drawing them into the mouth
