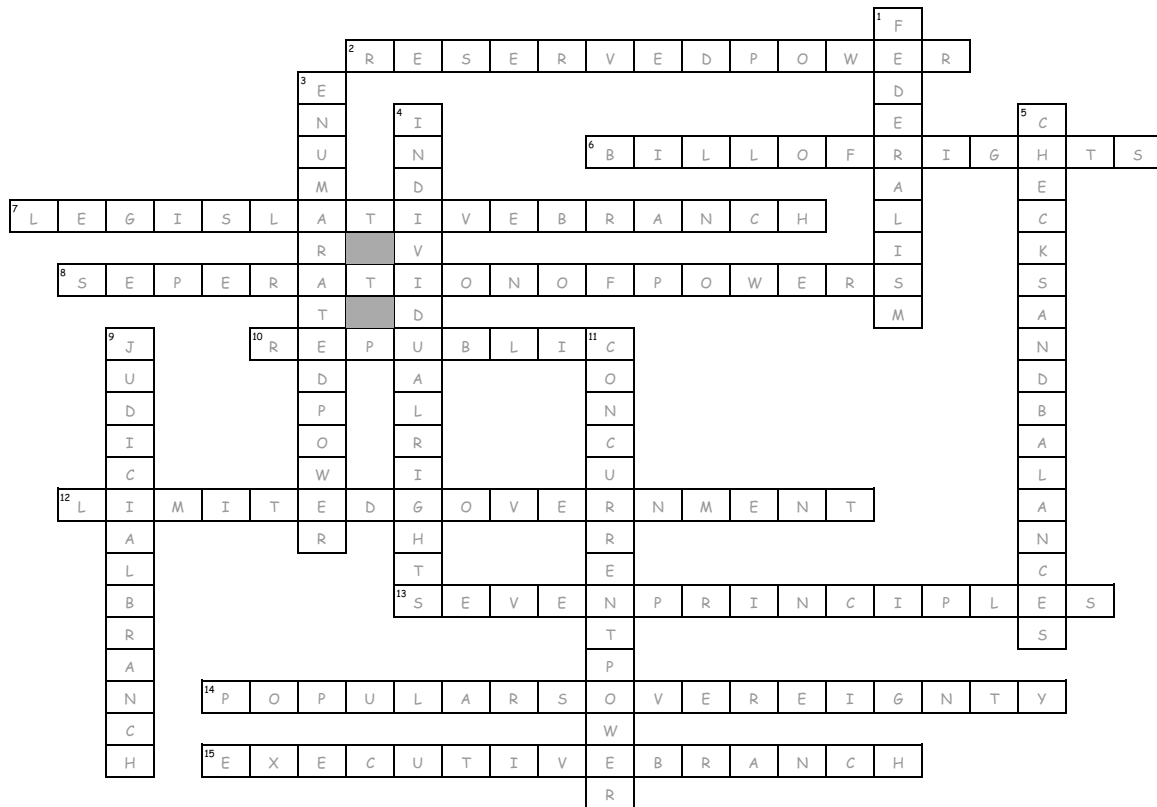


The 7 Principles Of The United States Constitution

1. A form of government in which power is divided between the federal government and state government
