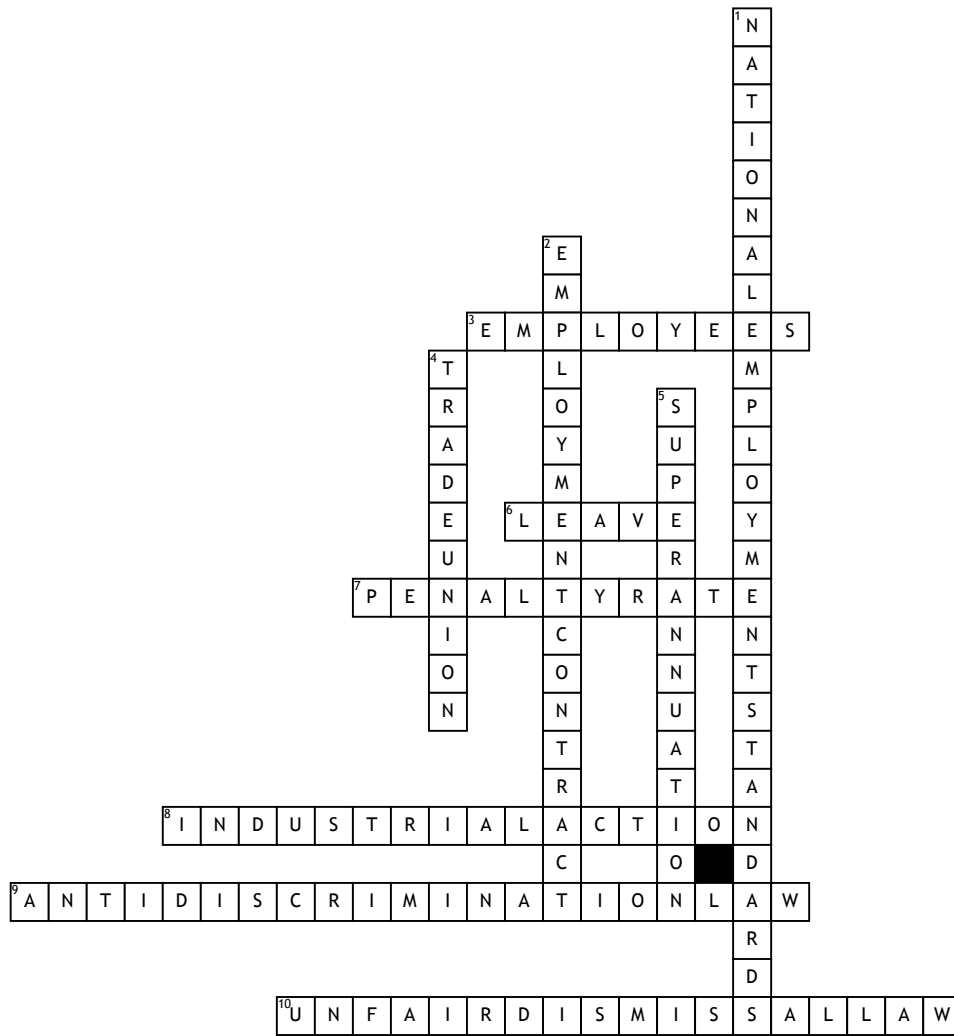

10. A system of appeal that allows employees to apply for reinstatement or compensation if they believe their employer has dismissed them in a 'harsh, unjust or unreasonable' manner and for reasons other than poor job performance

1. A safety net of 10 minimum conditions that employers must provide when offering employment contracts to employees.
2. A legally binding document between the employee and the employer, which sets out remuneration details such as pay rates, and entitlements like sick leave and annual leave.
4. An organisation established and financed by employees in similar fields to assist them in the workplace in order to increase their bargaining power.
5. A lump sum or regular payments received by retirees from income invested over their working life.
