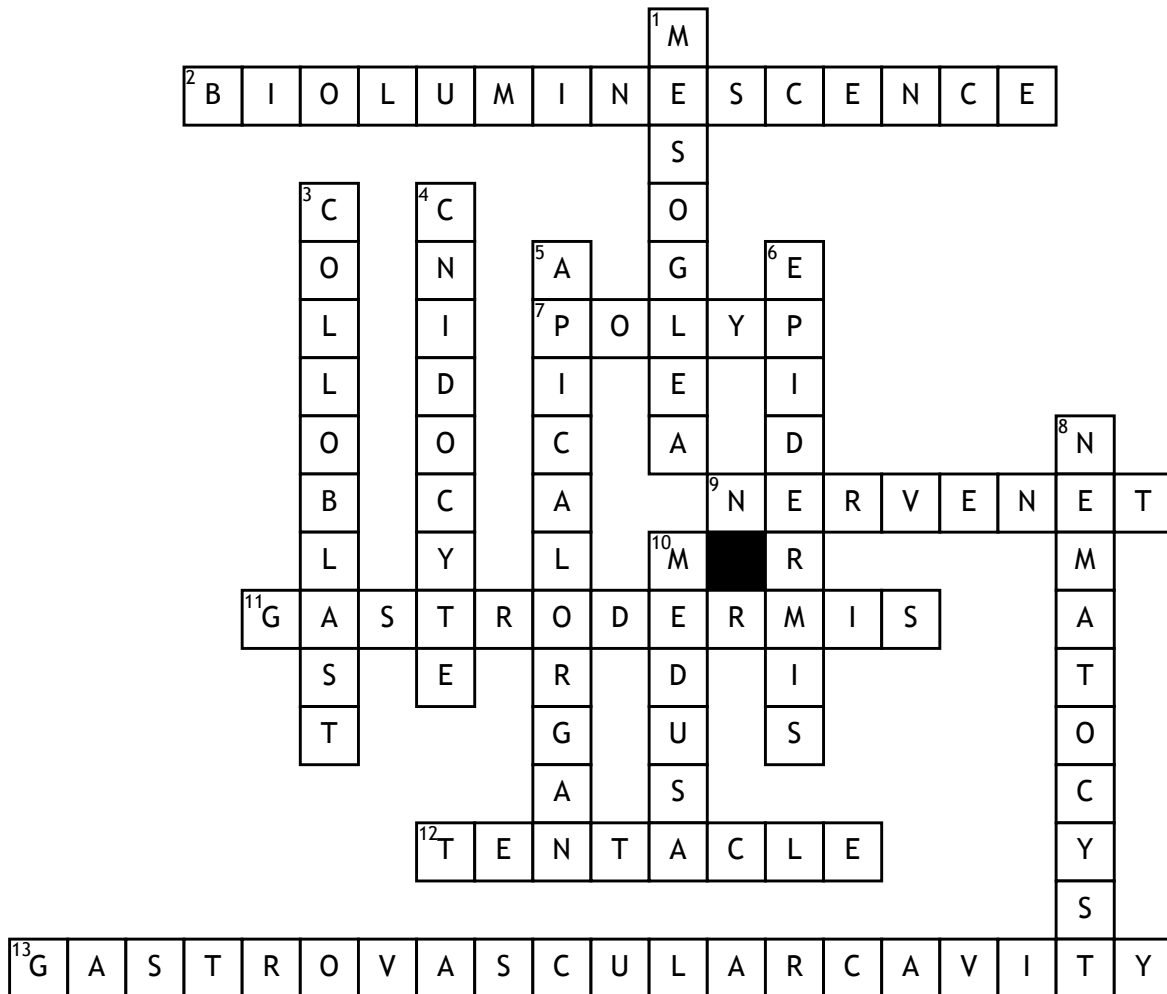


Cnidarians and Ctenophora
