

- **3.** The point where the kneecap and femur are connected in the trochlear groove
- **4.** The thin layer of connective tissue over the ends of long bone.

- **6.** A lubricating substance, produces by the synovial membrane, found in joints
- **7.** Cartilage in the knee between the femoral condyle and the medial tibial plaeteau
- **9.** A layer of tissue that lines joint cavities and produces synovial fluid.
- **10.** The top, flat portion of the tibia.
- **11.** A small bone formed in a tendon where it passes over a joint.
- **14.** A large group of four muscle in the front of the thigh.
- 17. Swelling within the joint cavity.
