

- **5.** Mapp v. Ohio The protection against "unreasonable searched and seizures."
- **6.** Texas v. Johnson Claimed that the man's expression of burning the flag is protected and legal.
- 7. Oregon v. Smith States could not deny unemployment benefits to a person for violating a state prohibition on the use of peyote.
- **10.** Dred Scott v. Sanford The Supreme Court ruled that Americans of African descent were not American citizens.
- **11.** Marbury v. Madison The Supreme Court was to determine what the Constitution says.
- **13.** Gitlow v. New York Argued that the U.S. Constitution First Amendment was protected and not to be restricted, taken away, or violated by state laws.

- **15.** Reynolds v. Sims: The Supreme Court ruled that the Equal Protection Clause required that the legislative districts across states be equal in population.
- **16.** Miranda v. Arizona Case ruled that detained criminals suspects, prior to questioning, must be informed of their constitutional rights.
- **17.** McCulloch v Maryland The "Necessary and Proper"; clause gave Congress the power to establish a national bank.
- **18.** Grutter v. Bolinger Supreme Court case ruled that the use of affirmative action in school admission is constitutional if it treats race as one factor among many.

- **1.** Engel v. Vitale Ruled that the Government should not endorse any religion belief system nor shall be involved itself in religious affairs.
- **2.** Plessy v. Ferguson It challenged state racial segregation laws for public facilities under the "separate but equal" doctrine.

- **3.** Tinker v. Des Moines Defined the constitutional rights of students in U.S. public schools.
- **4.** Roe v. Wade The woman's right to have an abortion.
- **8.** Reynolds v. US Ruled that case held that religious duty was not a defense to a criminal indictment.
- **9.** Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka The Supreme Court ruled that State-sanctioned segregation of public schools was unconstitutional.
- **12.** Gideon v. Wainwright Required states to provide defense attorneys to criminal defendants charged with offenses and cannot provide for one.
- **14.** Lemon v. Kurtzman The passing of a state law that establishes a religious body is unconstitutional.
