

5. WHEN AN INFANT FEARS OF UNFAMILIAR PEOPLE, USUALLY EXPRESSED BY CRYING. 8. TO SEE EVERTHING FROM ONE'S POINT OF VIEW

9. THE ABILITY TO MOVE HANDS AND FINGERS PRECISELY IN RELATION TO WHAT IS SEEN.

10. WHEN THE INFANT SHOWS SIGNS OF PLEASURE WHEN A PREFERRED PERSON APPEARS, AND SIGNS OF DISTRESS WHEN THAT PERSON LEAVES.

<u>Down</u>

1. THE UNDERSTANDING THAT AN OBJECT CONTINUES TO EXIST EVEN WHEN THE OBJECT IS OUT OF SIGHT

2. INSTINCTIVE, INVOLUNTARY BODY REACTIONS TO STIMULI SUCH AS NOISE OR TOUCH

3. SKILLS THAT REQUIRE THE COORDINATION OF VISION INTELLECT, AND MOVEMENT

4. SOUNDS THAT IMITATE ADULT LANGUAGE

6. WHEN AN INFANT REACTS BY THROWING OUT HIS/ HER ARMS AND LEGS IN RESPONSE TO A LOUD NOISE.

7. WHEN SOMETHING IS PUT IN A INFANTS MOUTH, THE BABY BEGINS TO SUCK.
