

- 2. Deciduous Forest
- **5.** Has plants that retain water to survive the dryness.
- 6. Otherwise known as Chaparral
- **9.** This biome has long, cold winters and short, warm, humid summers.
- **10.** An area of land where shrubs and small trees grow. The weather is usually dry and hot.
- 13. Rainforest
- **14.** Broadleaf forest dominates this biome, and deciduous trees loose their leaves in the winter.
- **16.** a flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions

- **17.** dry climates that receive less than 50 centimeters of rain each year
- **18.** Some moss and low lying plants survive. Summers last about 6 to 10 weeks, permafrost.
- **19.** Temperatures are warm throughout the year, with definite dry and rainy seasons .
