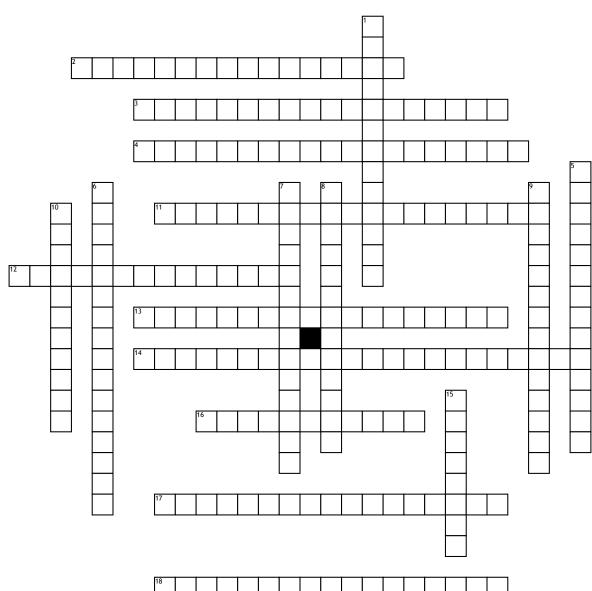
Moral Development

 theorist who developed the 6 stages of moral development
 concern for others' well being and needs only

4. morality is based on personal principles as well as universal principles

11. concern only for personal wants and needs

12. human responsibility

13. programs that integrate ethical understanding, care, and action

14. Trying to stay out of trouble

16. making decisions based on generally agreed upon principles of society

17. human rights

18. have some morality tied to them, but are mostly practical (driving on the right side of the road)

 theorist who critiqued Kohlberg and developed the 3 positions of the Morality of Care
 focus on the morality of the process by which laws or beliefs are created **6.** "changes in moral beliefs as a person grows older and gains maturity." (Seifert, Sutton, 53)

8. knowing versus doing9. coordination of personal needs and values with those of others

10. making decisions based on the morals of friends and peers
