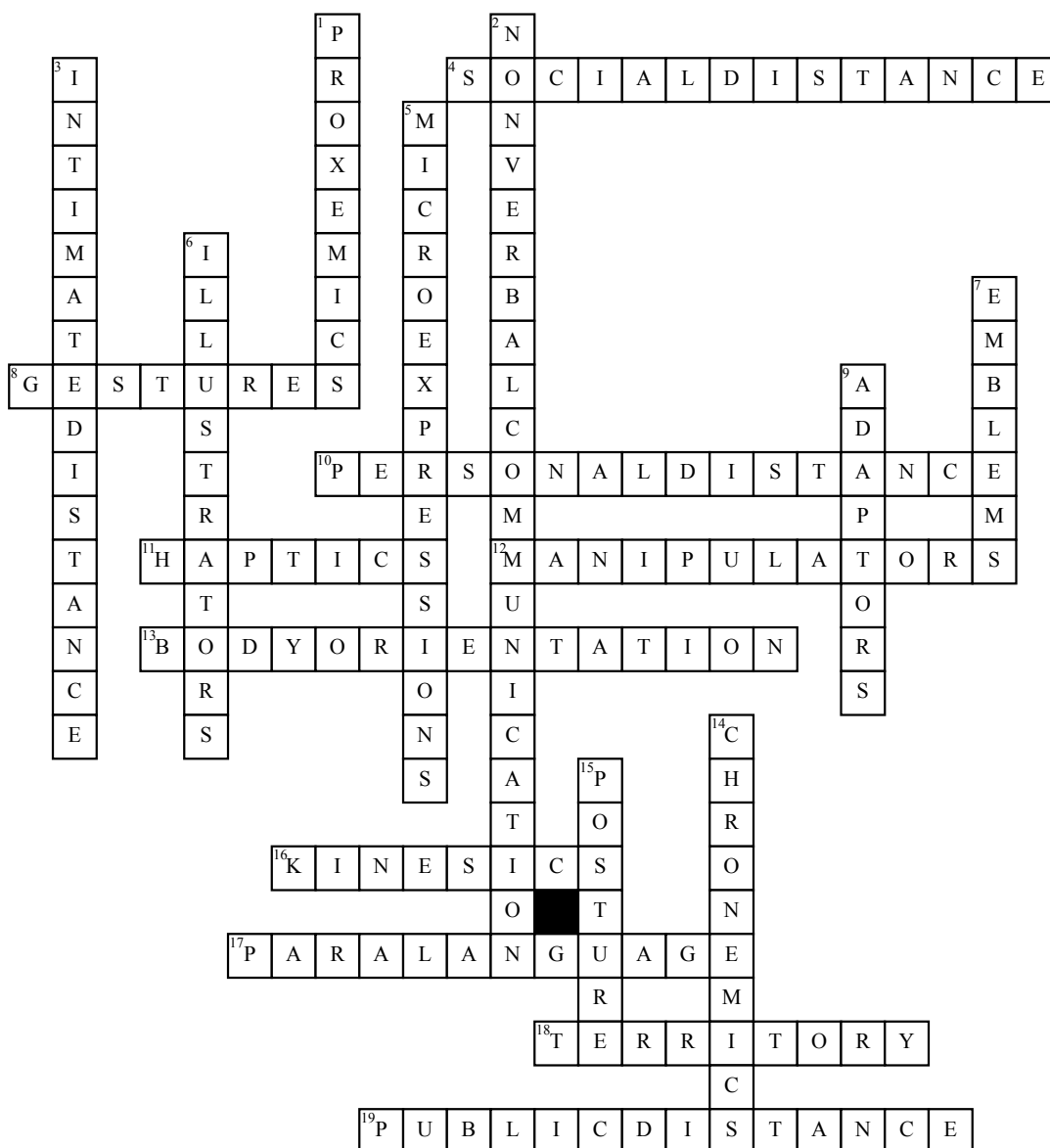


# Types of Nonverbal Communication

4. Hall's 3rd spatial zone: 4 feet to 12 feet away
8. Movement of the hands and arms
10. Second spatial zone: 18 inches to 4 feet away
