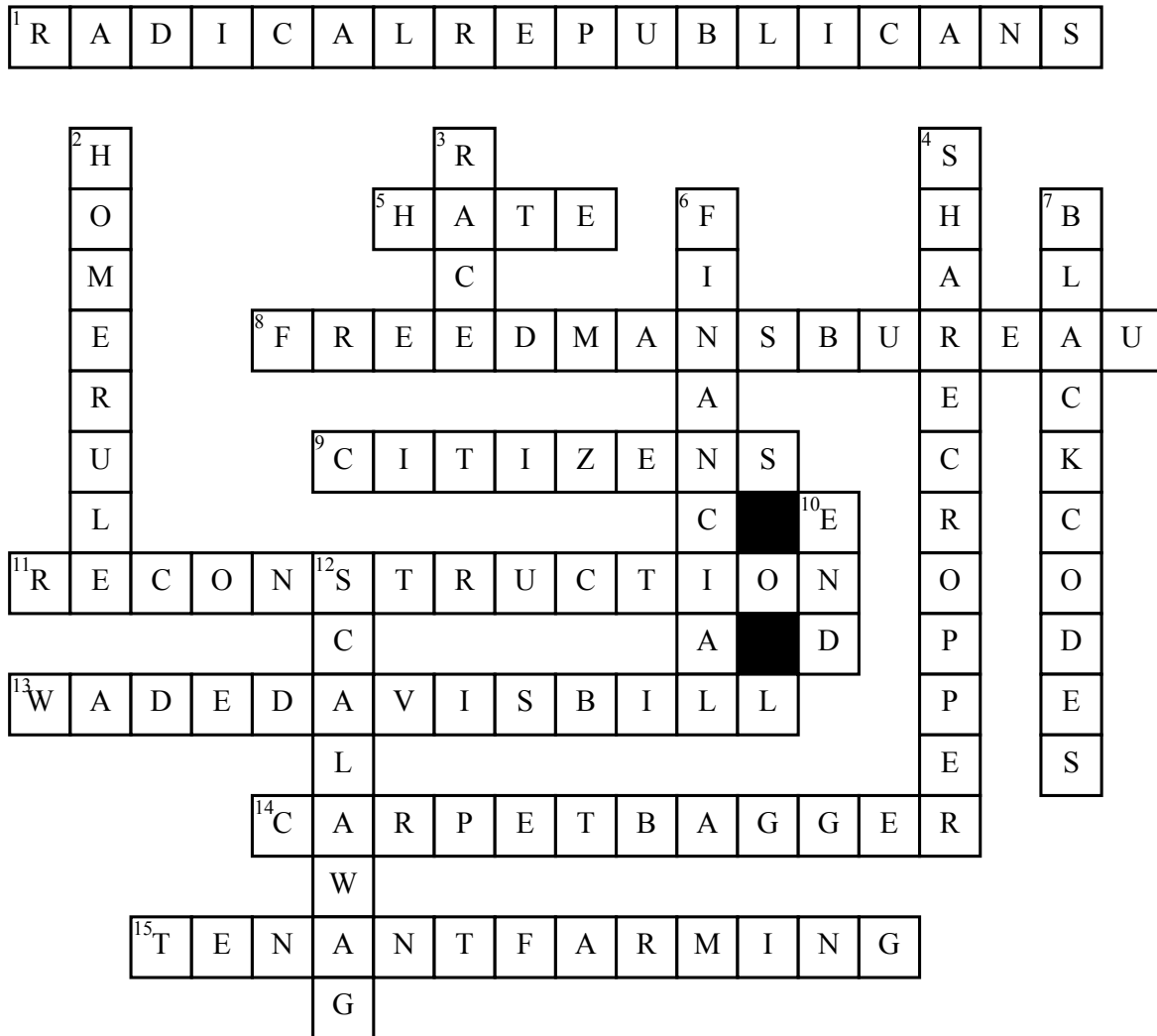


American Reconstruction Crossword Puzzle
