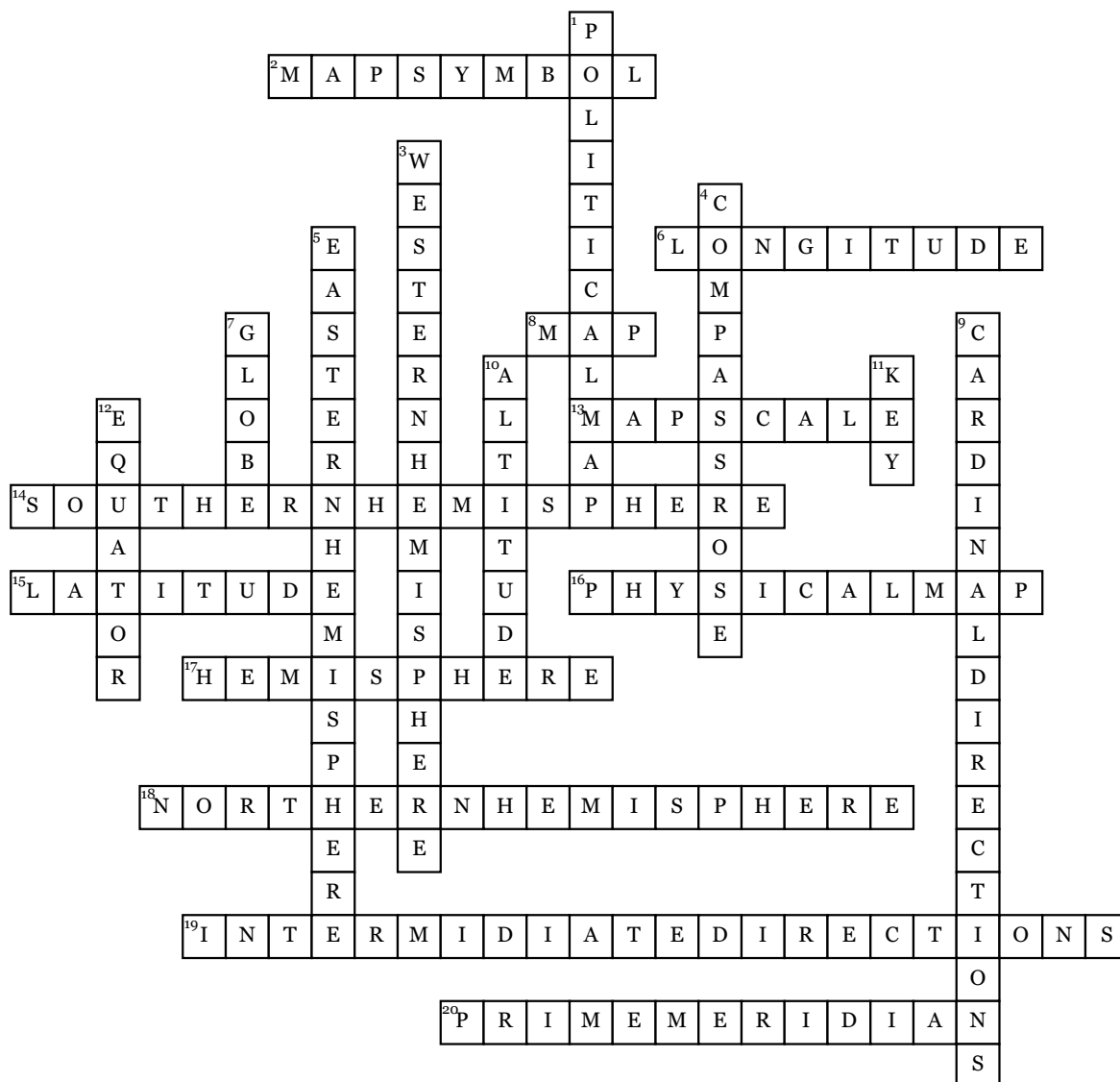


# Map Terminology
