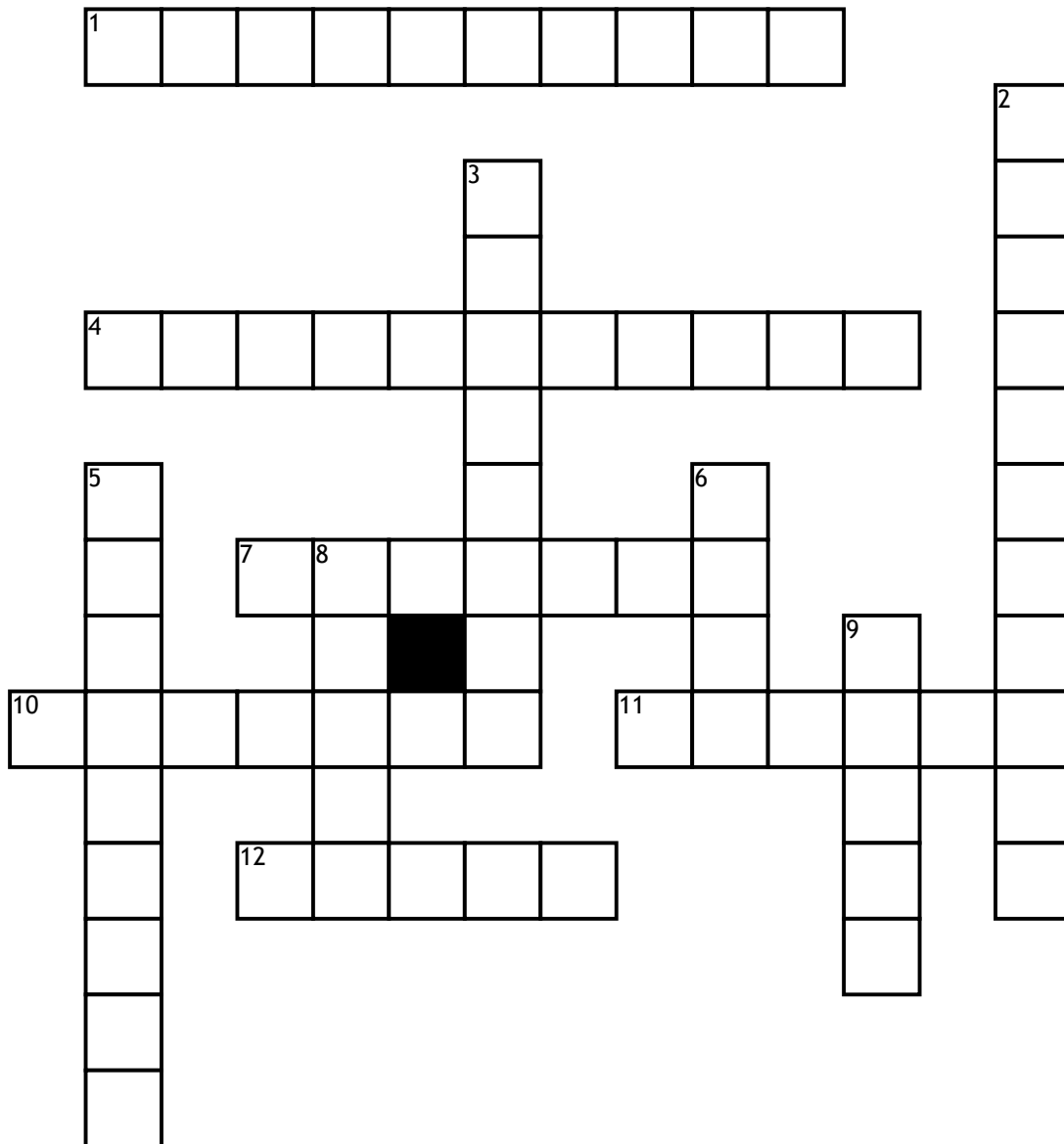


Dia de los Muertos/Day of the Dead
