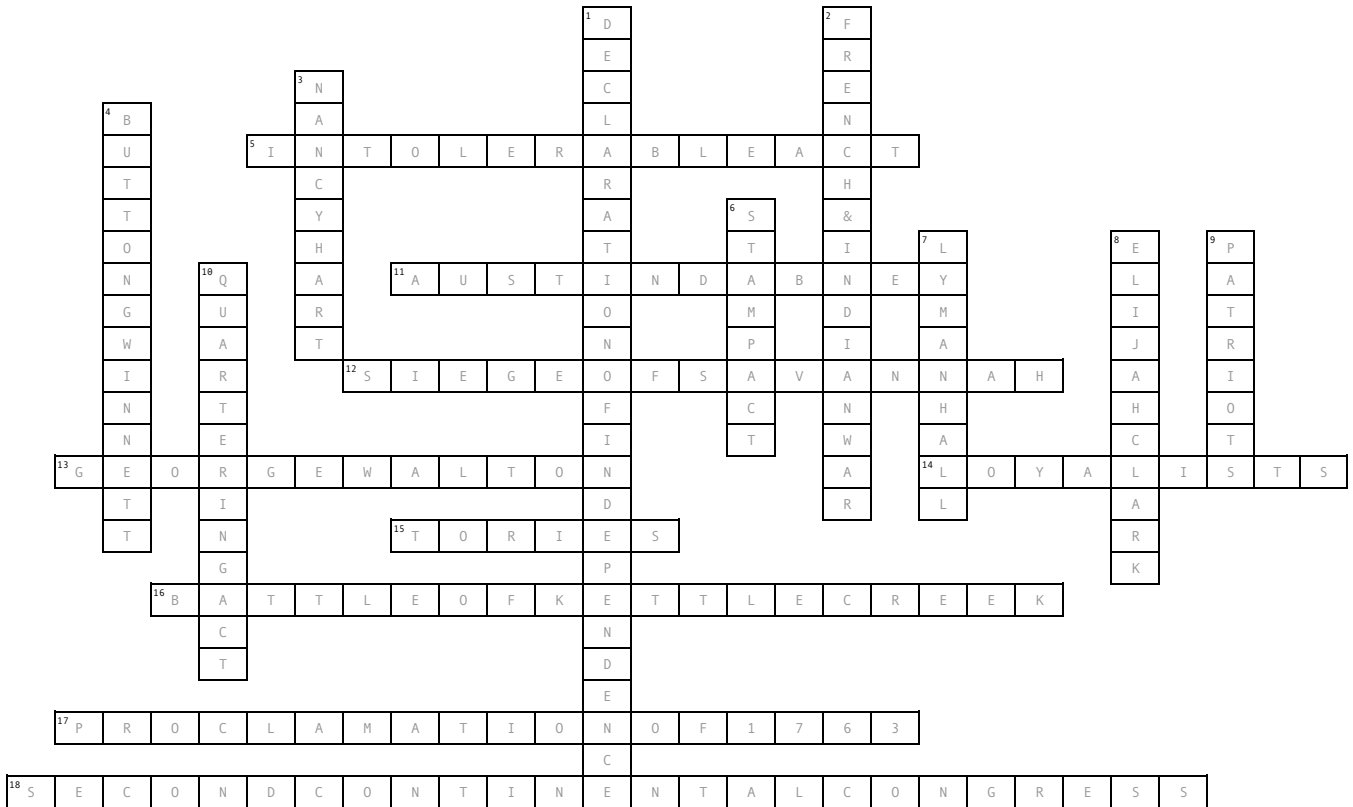


CAUSE OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION
