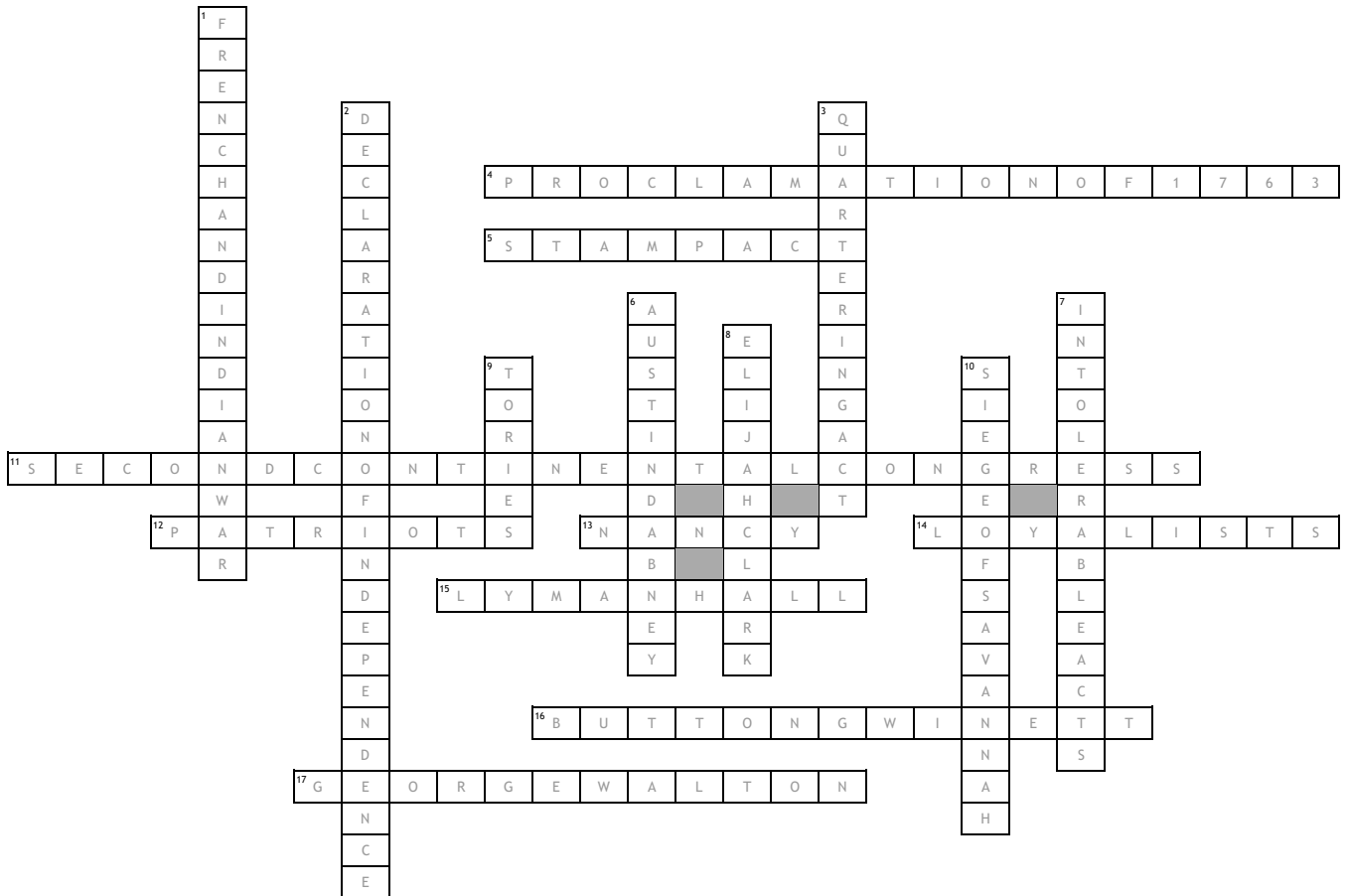


Causes of the American Revolution

- was issued October 7, 1763, by King George III following Great Britain's acquisition of French territory in North America
- Passed by the British Parliament on March 22, 1765.
- managed the Colonial war effort and moved incrementally towards independence, adopting the United States Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776.
- Fought for American rights
- Rebel Heroine
- American colonists who remained loyal to the British Crown during the American Revolutionary War.
- Hall County is named after him
- One of the founding fathers
- signed the United States Declaration of Independence as a representative of Georgia and also served as the second Chief Executive of Georgia

- comprised the North American theater of the worldwide Seven Years' War of 1756-63.
- declaration of statehood is an assertion by a defined territory that it is independent and constitutes a state.
- name given to a minimum of two Acts of British Parliament in the local governments of the American colonies
- slave that fought with the whigs
- harsh laws passed by the British Parliament in 1774.
